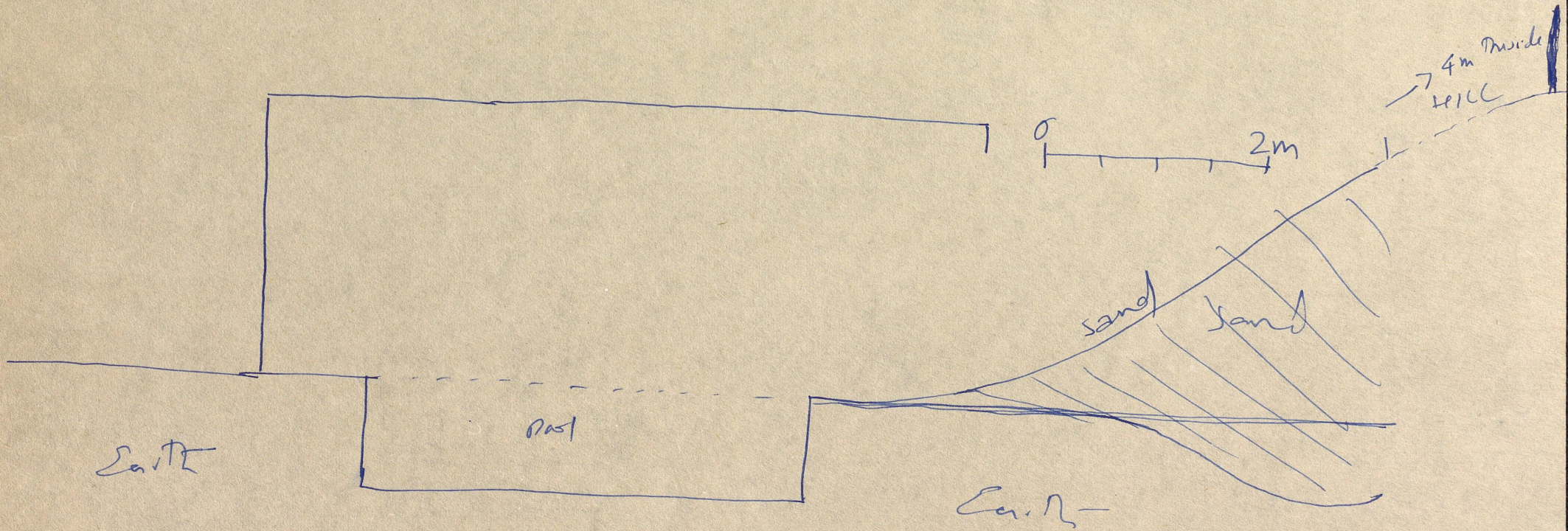

Dinosaurs' survivors bred in captivity

MADRAS, Aug. 15

For the first time in India the great and very rare salt-water crocodile—one of the few survivors of the dinosaurs that were wiped out 56 million years ago—was bred in captivity. Twelve have been hatched at the Madras Crocodile Bank and eight more are expected to emerge over the independence holiday.

This is the world's largest species of the crocodilian family. One shot in Orissa in the 1930s was authenticated by scientists at Calcutta Zoo. The female was 24 feet but it is certain that older specimens that exist reach 30 feet or more (like all reptiles, crocodiles continue to grow through out their life). Because of their very valuable skins, the crocodile has become extinct and the world are in the Sunderbans, the mouth of the Mahanadi river in Orissa, and in the Andamans and Nicobar islands. A few specimens have been hatched in captivity from eggs collected in the wild but the Madras Crocodile Bank is the first place in India where a pair have actually mated and successfully bred. The mother of these was collected as an egg in the Andamans in 1976 by Rom Whitaker, founder and director of the crocodile breeding bank. The male, originally from Thailand, was a gift of the Thai government, starting with a capital of only 100 dollars now has a farm containing over 20,000 crocodiles and is a multi-millionaire. On a smaller scale, cottage industry type crocodile farms have been started, with Whitaker's expert assistance and under the auspices of the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the UNO, in such places as Papua New Guinea. Thus, not only are these threatened species saved from certain extinction, but prosperity has unexpectedly dawned on people with precious few other natural resources. And as a spin off, for those (like myself) who have no religious or cultural hang-ups on what they eat, crocodile meat (mainly from the huge muscular tail) is excellent rather like good veal.
