Dear Dr. Cohen:

I thank you for your letter dated September 16th, 1968. I am still here and have not gone out of this country since my return in 1964.

I am glad to hear that Dr. Silberstein has approached you to participate in the preparation of a symposium on migrant populations. As for the data on Cochin Jews, we have studied them in two lots. In the first lot, we studied about 200 individuals (both males and females) for blood groups A_1A_2BO ; Rh_0 (D); M and N; Colour Vision; P.T.C. tasting and Sickling test. These were on the samples collected at Cochin and its surroundings. The second lot comprising of 100 individuals (males and females) were collected at Bombay when they were on their way to Israel. These were tested for blood group A_1A_2BO ; Rh including subtypes (-C, -c, -D and -E); M and N and Secretor Status.

These data are not published yet and we shall be glad to present this material at the Symposium. You may talk to Dr. Silberstein and decide how best this data could be utilized.
