As such he is traveling from Italy via India to Australia to take part in the General Assembly of Scientific Radio in Sydney, which opens around Aug. 8th.

Professor Burrows who is also director of the important School of Electrical Engineering at Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y., is an expert in laboratory development in the field of telecommunication and electronics.
