" a great many paupers have recently come into the station, but it is not intended that they shall remain here.

The Commissioner is about to establish a relief camp at the toll gates on the Coonoor ghat. The site selected is well suited for intercepting the influx of paupers coming in up from Coimbatore.

July 18, No 55

All those who received (relief at Musnagoody) are fully entitled to it. Of all on the list on Saturday 26th, at noon, not one was left for the lightest + sand.

I doubt if more than a few will survive about a month or two without the greatest care. They seemed to be all in the last stage of emaciation or suffering from the disease induced by starvation."

"The gang consists almost wholly of strangers from the Mysore country. They arrive at Murrigoody or are reported to be lying by the road and are brought on by the Manager."

It has been a practice to give strangers one days food, and ordered them to move or if they could possibly move. This fact accounts

for the number of deaths on the Legon
