I mentioned to my friend that I met you, when you were in Calcutta last December, and that you very sympathetically told me, that you will try to do something for my boy N. V. Rao. He wrote to Mr Thacker on that very day, but he lets me he does not expect any reply from him. Mr Thacker may not take any initiative in this matter, and as he advised me before, I hope he will give his support to any proposal you may put up for my son.

Can I request you, sir, to take up the matter, and if you think so, even after consulting Mr Thacker. I hope surely something good will come out, and ^{as} I see no ^{other} way of my son getting any job in India.

I am troubling you with this letter, ^{as} that, in case, my son has very little chance of securing a job in India, I shall have to decide once for all about my future stay in Calcutta. For a retired man like me my minimum expenses in Calcutta are too

heavy and my few savings are dwindling away
month after month.

Mr Jaggaewho has wrote to me a few
days back a letter inviting me & my children
to go to Belhi in April, and that I may
try personally for my son. I do not see
in what way my presence at Belhi will help
matters. I feel it is too expensive a trip for
pleasure.

I shall end this letter, with a fervent
prayer to Him, that He may give you the
scope to help me. Please do help me.

In case you happen to meet
Mr Jaggaewho has, you may let him know
about my son's chances, and he will surely
intimate it to me.
