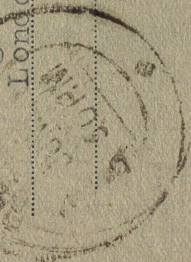

Dear Professor Krishnan,

I understand that the FIAT reviews of German Science can be ordered from H.K.Lewis, Bookseller, Gower Street, London, W.C.1. although they are not yet actually published.
