Dear Prof. Krishnam,

After a long expectation I have just received your letter of ~~July~~ 21st. Aug.

Dr. Tarachand has written to me several letters, and in his last letter he says that he will be able to make ~~me~~ a definite offer ^{to me} in a short time.

There is no doubt that the work given to me in the Dept. is to my liking and in my line. I am now to build a new building for an Ionospheric and Magnetic observatory in the Pinnacelly district through which the magnetic equator passes. I shall very soon be proceeding on tour to South for ^a preliminary selection of site. I shall be grateful to you for introductory letters to your brother and others.

But the difficulty in which I find myself is that I may be confined to South throughout

the service period. The present tendency is that instruction should be in the mother tongue - which will be Tamil - and hence my children's education will suffer ~~too~~ unless I keep them at Allahabad or Delhi. This means a double establishment, which I cannot afford. Hence I am seriously thinking of returning either to Allahabad or to take up some other work in Northern India. That is why I wrote to you my letter of June 4th.

In the dept. many things happen, which outside people cannot know.

We shall talk about these when we meet.

At present there are no chances of my coming to Delhi unless I am asked by the Dept. to come up for some discussion.

My dear Dr. Krishnan,

Probably you have been informed about the decision of the Univ. authorities here. They mean to offer you the grade Rs 800-1250, and to give you a start of Rs 1000/- . It will be a great pleasure to me if you accept. I told you at Calcutta that we get Rs 9000/- grant for the teaching of B.Sc. + M.Sc. classes, and an additional Rs 5000/- for research. This grant was personal to Prof. Saha, but there is no reason why it should not be permanent. We have been getting it even when Dr. Saha is not with us. It is just possible that you may get a

non recurring grant for any
special apparatus that you
need. You may write to the
authorities & find out the position.
