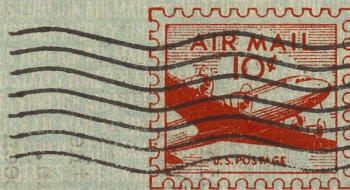
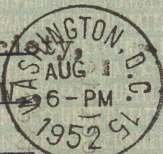
10. In implementation of the recommendation (c) of the Electrical & Radio Engineering Committee Dr. G.K.M. Pfestorf, Professor of High Voltage Engineering, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore was invited to submit a scheme for enamelling of copper wires.

This scheme in brief is give below :

A. SCOPE & AIM:

1. India should be capable at the end of this scheme to do all the enamelling of wires from 0.02 mm to 2.0 mm diameter in the country in a quality equal to any American or European specification and to meet the full demand of the country by increasing the experimental facilities of the laboratory.
2. India should be able to use as much as possible raw materials of the country in the production of enamelled copper wires.

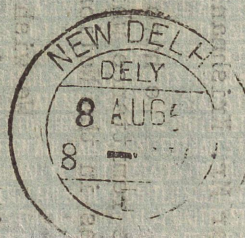

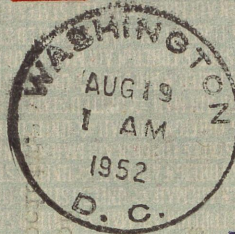
