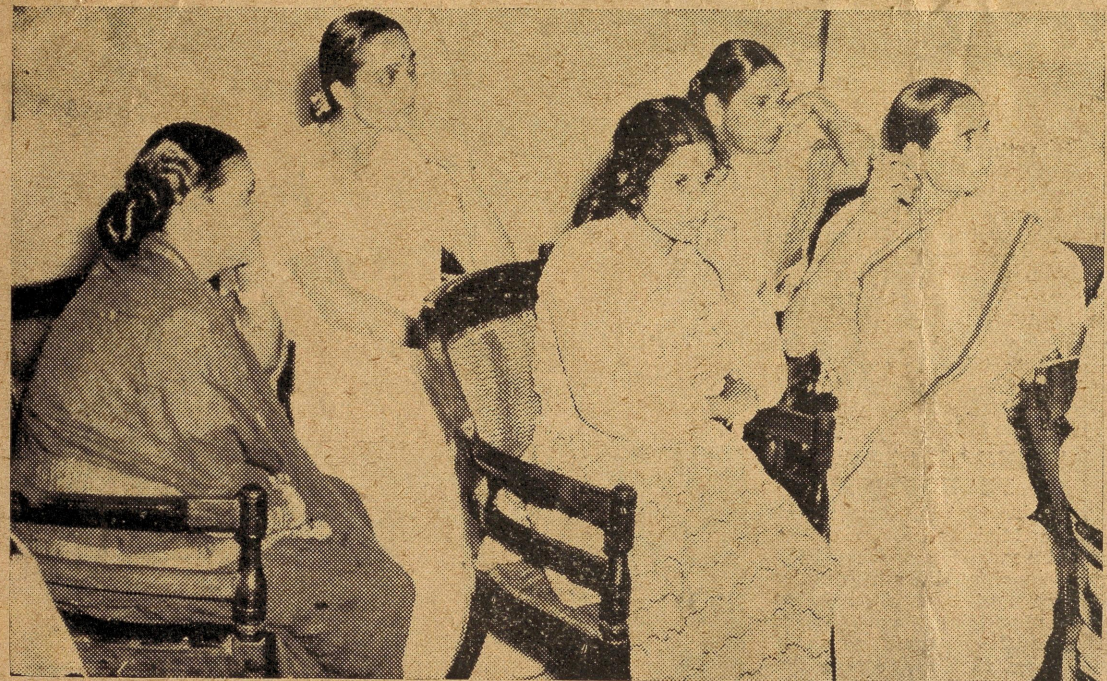
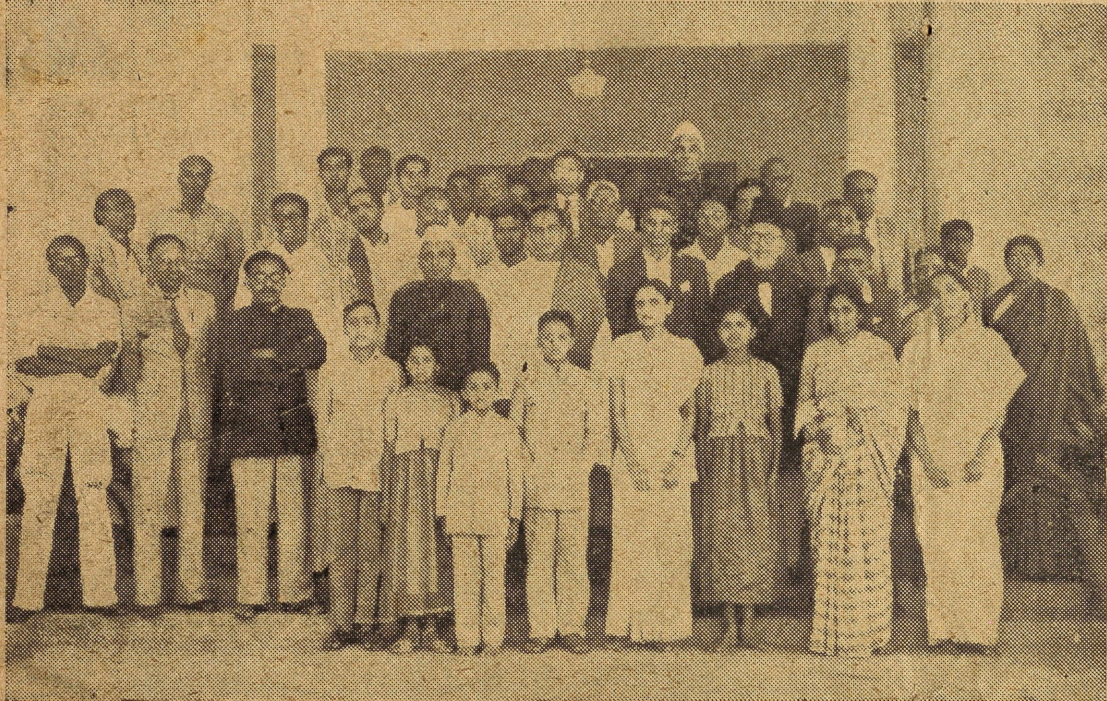

THOUSANDS CHEER

DHEBAR: But They Hoped To See Nehru

MADRAS, Sunday: The Congress President, Mr. U. N. Dhebar, arrived in the city today at 4 p.m. by special train. Quite a big crowd of top-ranking Congressmen including Mr. Kamaraj Nadar, Ramnath Goenka and others were present at the station. The Congress President found it difficult to come out of the platform and inspect the guard of honour provided by the Seva Dal volunteers drawn up outside.

There was a regular mobbing and Kamaraj could be seen battling in the midst of it to keep the handful of big shots away, who wanted to be in the limelight. There was a crush at the doorway of the platform in which some women were injured. At last, the President reviewed the guard of honour and later mounted the Plymouth car specially got up for the occasion with Congress flags painted on it. The procession preceded by Congress volunteers on motor-cycles and then followed by Seva Dal volunteers in well ordered arrays carrying Congress flags wended its way from the Railway Station along the main roads of the city.

The Pongal holiday crowds gathered in curiosity along the procession route and the most significant fact that although the president fulfilled his role by waving and folding his hands in Namaskar, the crowd looked on in

stony curiosity at the pomp and splendour of a "free show". The interest with which the common man follows Congress policies could be measured from the fact that MOST PEOPLE WERE UNDER THE IMPRESSION THAT MR. NEHRU WAS COMING IN PROCESSION AND THERE WERE QUITE A BIG SECTION OF THE CROWD, WHO DECLARED THAT THEY HAD BEEN FOOLED BY THE WRONG IMPRESSION GAINED BY THEM. It is a significant fact that the welcome banners and arches put along the road were the handwork of big business firms in the city and Gujerathis and Marwaris residing in the city were foremost in shouting 'jai' for the President. They, however, were an insignificant minority in a crowd, who for the major part were idle onlookers of a pompous show without semblance of popular support.—F.O.C.

BANGALORE, Monday: Mystery surrounds the death of an unknown man on the railway track running parallel to the Bore Bank Road, Civil Station, Bangalore. The head of the man was found severed from the body and the clothes lay scattered near the rail track. Eye witnesses, who saw the body on Friday morning, are reported to have told the police that they did not suspect it to be merely an accident.

BANGALORE, Monday: Addressing the gathering at the Gudali Pooja of the Congress Exhibition, at Subhash Nagar, this morning, Mr. T. Channaiah, Minister for Local Self-Government, stated that exhibitions were a medium to understand the culture and industrial and economic progress of different parts. He recalled how the Dasara Exhibition had been a source of inspiration for other States to conduct such exhibitions at various places.

The Minister hoped that the Congress in future would try to build a permanent building for conducting exhibitions.

Bombayites Protest Against Fountainpen "Fatwa"

BOMBAY, Monday: A point, among many, on which the Bombay Government has made a laughing stock of itself with the public is its latest "fatwa", threatening penal action against schools, which do not enforce the order banning the use of fountain-pens by pupils. This meaningless, short-sighted and retrograde fiat has come in for a good deal of criticism by some of the papers here.

Some well-known public and social workers whom SATYA's correspondent interviewed on the question were unanimous in condemning the order as an ugly symptom of a trend towards regimentation which had already manifested itself in hotels and restaurants being forced to shut their doors after 11 p.m. and even in looking with official disfavour at those people who listen to foreign radio stations.—F.O.C.

College Lecturer On Abduction Charge

DAVANGERE, Sunday: Mr. Sarvotham, a Lecturer of Shimoga Intermediate College, was arrested here on Saturday morning, on charge of abducting a minor girl, Jayanthibai, a student studying in the same college and belonging to a different community. Both were produced before the Magistrate and remanded to custody.

A complaint filed by the mother of the girl states that Mr. Sarvotham induced her daughter to run away with him.—F.O.C.

'Varsity To Have Music College

MYSORE, Monday: The Chief Minister, Mr. K. Hanumanthaiya, announced here today that the Mysore University would shortly have a college of music housed at the present A.I. India Radio Station at Mysore. The college could be a centre for learning of Bharatanatyam and Music.

The Chief Minister, who was declaring open the newly-constructed Municipal Swimming Pool near Kukkarahali Tank, this morning, said that the proposed college would flourish and prosper and prove a "jewel" in the beautiful city of Mysore and hoped that it would be very much useful to student in the city.

Earlier, the City Municipal President, Mr. K. Puttaswamy, welcoming the gathering, said that the present swimming pool had been constructed in place of a pond that had been constructed in that every place over three ago for use of travellers to take rest.

Weekly Stock Exchange's Review

LACK OF FOLLOW-UP SUPPORT EASES PRICES ALL-ROUND

Improvement Likely In Madras Shares

After continued improvement during the previous week, industrials on the Bombay and Calcutta Stock Exchanges experienced profit-taking during the early part of this week with the result that prices eased all round due to lack of follow-up support. Higher levels attracted scattered selling pressure and steel, textile and miscellaneous shares moved within a narrow range.

At the end of the week, hesitancy had gone and markets were in a mood to look-up, as operators seemed to have been heartened by the present weakness in commodities, which would help the industry considerably to reduce its manufacturing costs and also to increase the savings of the community.

Madras Stock Exchange worked for only three days, due to the Pongal holidays. Trading on this Stock Exchange was notable for considerable activity in Tea and textile shares. General tone for rubber shares was very steady.

Coffee shares kept improving with quick absorption of select shares encouraged by the announcement of the India Coffee Board to release during the months of January and February 1955, 2,000 tons of Coffee for export out of 1954-55 crop. Textile shares became firm up showing good rises over the previous week. Sugar shares, which were neglected all these days, came in for increased attention. The Mysore Electricity strike had very little effect on the temper of the Mysore shares. The present trading trend indicates that there could be neither

many floating scrips, nor weak bulls in the Madras Market. Further, many shares bear full year's dividend and yield on these shares at current rates is higher. Further improvement from the present levels could be expected, provided the other sister exchanges remain very strong, otherwise fall in these shares may not be steep like shares of Bombay and Calcutta markets.

So far as bank's shares are concerned, indications are that the Government of India are likely to adopt only a GO-SLOW policy and in the near future it is only the Imperial Bank of India, which is likely to claim their attention. Prospects, therefore, are that price of many of the Bank shares will start recovering.

POLITICO-ECONOMIC EVENTS

Many events of importance happened during the week under review having a direct relation on the price of shares.

The relaxation in world tension is expected as a result of the U.N. Secretary General's mission to China. An agreement between U.S.A. and Pakistan for 11 Om dollars Economic aid was signed to enable Pakistan to import large quantities of industrial raw materials and essential consumer goods to attain economic stability of that country. U.S.A. has a scheme for disposing off by sale or gift abroad 578m. dollars worth of surplus Farm products tantamounting to 'DUMPING' American Farm Products on world markets thus having a disruptive influence on world agricultural prices. Britain's eagerness to help India in her 'GREAT AND EXCITING' development plans now in progress was indicated by the Minister of State in the British Board of Trade.

A steel production target of 4-1/2 million tons by 1960 was fixed by the Government of India and negotiations in respect of Soviet and British offers would be based on this target. The expansion of existing steel manufacturing plants (as already reported in these columns) would be considered with that object in view. Merger of All India Forward Block with the Indian National Congress was an indication of complete confidence the Forward Block had in the dynamic and inspiring leadership of Pundit Jawaharal Nehru, who is determined to take the country towards the Socialistic pattern of Society, which is possible only under his leadership.

RAISING THE LEVEL OF PRODUCTION

The Union that the Government of India Minister of Agriculture declared was not in a position at the present juncture either to consider the price fixation for food grains or for purchasing them. While discussing the economic policy of the country, the Committee of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry has urged the Government of India to see that in the field in which Private Enterprise could operate effectively to raise the level of production and extend employment, it had the fullest scope and encouragement. Union Finance Minister sounded a note of robust optimism in regard to the implementation of the SECOND FIVE YEAR PLAN of the order of Rs. 5/6,000 crores.

BANKS: Dividend of 6 per cent. p.a. was declared by the Indian Bank and the Indian Overseas Bank. Profits of many big banks were available and as anticipated in these columns, profits of those banks were higher than the previous year. Profit of the Bank of Mysore Ltd., may be expected to be over Rs. 17 lakhs for the year, which is a little higher than the previous year. In spite of better profits earned by the Banks, shares of those Banks were on offer at or even below the quoted rates. Bank of Mysore had a steep fall from Rs. 310,297-8 p.c. and even at this price business was very difficult for want of buyers.

PLANTATIONS: TEA: There was very strong demand for all types of tea in auction sale. The immediate reaction on the increase in Export Duty and Export Quota was fall in quota

prices and temporary arrest in rise in price of shares. As all Tea Companies were expected to absorb this extra levy without difficulty and the present level of prices were based only on average price of Rs. 2-8 to Rs. 2-12 per lb. and would give an yield of over 10 per cent. in several cases, activity was not effected. Moreover prices had begun to improve with large blocks changing hands.

Periakaramalais have declared 15 per cent. interim, same as last year. Alageswars at Rs. 2-14 Balanors at Rs. 17-4 Coorg Teas at Rs. 9-7 Kalasas at Rs. 12-4 were all buyers. Bue Mountains at Rs. 3-10 Waterfalls at Rs. 3-10 Neelmalais at Rs. 7 Cheembra Peaks at Rs. 4-11-6 Kil Kotagiris at Rs. 6-15 Periakaramalais at Rs. 8-8 C.D. Nigiri Teas at Rs. 16-6 were all buyers.

RUBBER: Cochin Malabars at Rs. 7-2 Pullangodes at Rs. 3-3 Rajagiris at Rs. 13-12 Vaikundams at Rs. 20-4 were freely taken up.

COFFEE: Chairman of the Consolidated Coffee Estates hinted that the present peak price of coffee was probably over and that all efforts were made to reduce the cost of production. Cons. Coffees at Rs. 17 XD Coffee Lands at Rs. 15-2 Puthuthottams at Rs. 4-8 Overseas at Rs. 5-12 were freely bought.

TEXTILES: These had a broadening of enquiry under the

lead of Lakshmis, who had declared an interim dividend of 10 per cent, same as last year, and the shares improved to Rs. 145. Buckingham at Rs. 157. Dhana-lakshmis at Rs. 305. Rajalakshmis at Rs. 140. SKRS at Rs. 76. Maduras at Rs. 47-4 were the other shares to show a rise.

MISCELLANEOUS: Andhra Cements 'B' improved to Rs. 13-6 Indian Cements at Rs. 21-10 FACTS at Rs. 5-2 Mettur Chemicals at Rs. 8-12 CD Parrys at Rs. 4-10 Mysore Papers at Rs. 17-10 Mysore Chemicals and Fertilizers at Rs. 10-8 were all buyers.

Uncertainties still persist and the coming budget would be well worth watching for a definite trend of the Market. The Stock Market is probably trying to reconcile with the new economic pattern emerging in the country, but how far it will succeed remains to be seen. The overall economic picture, however, is satisfactory at present and unless the coming budget holds any surprises, investors need have no cause for anxiety.

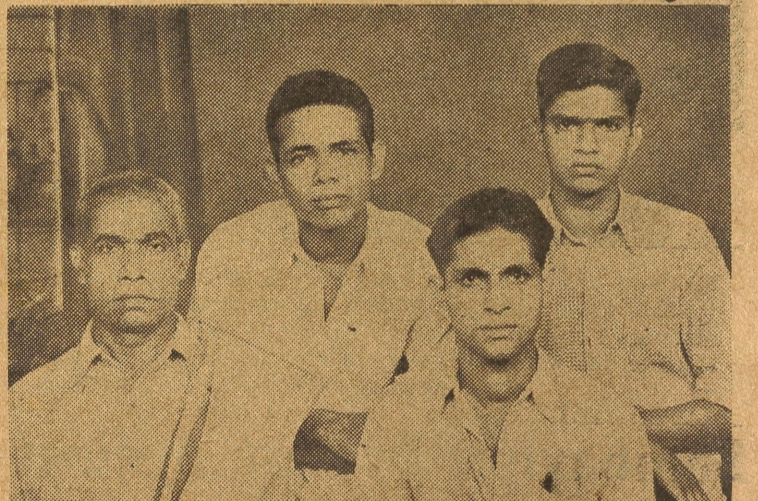

C. M. Muthiah Becomes Athletic Champion

The Second State Athletic Championships conducted by The Mysore State Amateur Athletic Association concluded yesterday at the Olympic Stadium.

Inaugurating the meet, Dr. B. S. Madhava Rao, D.Sc., the Principal of the Central College, on the opening day mentioned why he appreciated and participated in sports activities. He, being a keen sportsman, found beauty in an athlete, his body and mind gives a pleasure to find out the difference between right and left and left and right. He, being a Doctor of Science, could easily find out the difference and appreciates the beauty.

He impressed on the athletes four essential points to remember. (1) Enthusiasm, (2) Planning, (3) Coaching and (4) Training. Finally he reminded all the athletes to participate in the Olympic spirit "Not to Win, but to participate."

Muthiah became the State Athletic Champion by scoring 21 points followed by B. B. Appachoo of Engineering College with 11 points.

It is deplorable to see in a population of 10 lakhs, only 80 participants in Men's events, about 20 in boys' and 12 in Ladies' events. The crowds, who are usually the backbone of any sports activities, were very thin.

In the closing remarks, the Director of Public Instruction in Mysore mentioned that HE was not satisfied in the way the meet was conducted. He mentioned that by a directive of the Government, he was forming a Mysore State Sports and Athletic Council when all the moral and material support will be given to encourage sports in the State.

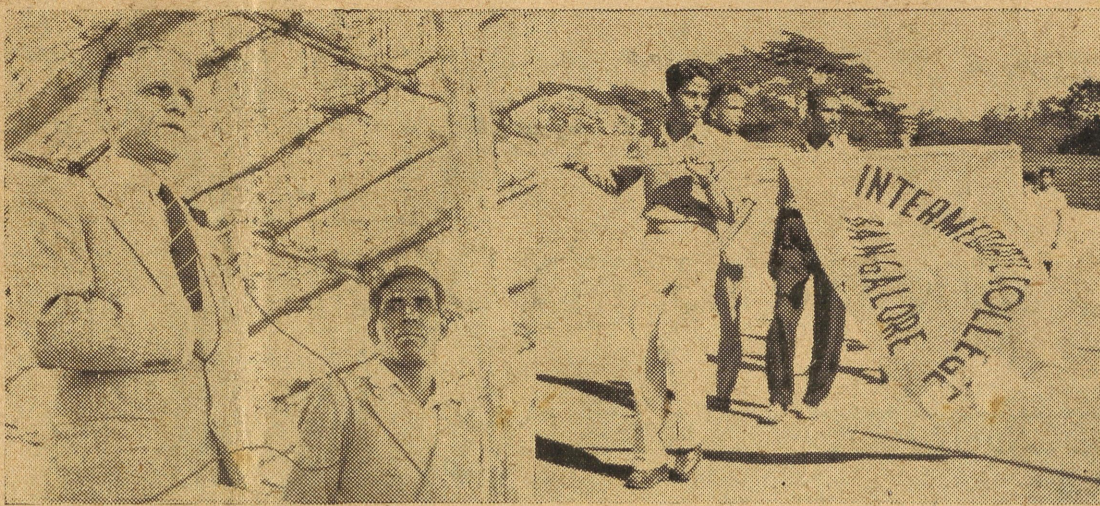

Achievements Of City Corporation During Seetharam's Mayoralty

BANGALORE, Monday: At an after dinner speech yesterday at Thippagondanahalli, Mr. H. S. Seetharam, the outgoing Mayor of Bangalore, detailed the progressive work that the Corporation had turned out during his tenure of office. He made a special mention of his efforts to obtain a central grant of about three crores of rupees to afford greater civic amenities to the people of Bangalore.

He hoped that the incoming Mayor and the Corporation Commissioner would spare no efforts in this direction and would visit Delhi and impress upon the Union Government the necessity of the loan and obtain it.

During Mr. Seetharam's tenure of office, the Corporation held 52 meetings and the Standing Committees held 201 meetings, and they disposed of 738 and 1,734 subjects respectively. The Health Department carried out the normal duties satisfactorily. There was no out-break of any epidemic disease in the city. There was no case of plague and only two cases of cholera. Anti-misquito work was intensified by the introduction of power sprayers and there was re-organisation of the work on a large scale. Family Planning Centres, which were opened at the various maternity homes and Child Welfare Centres, continued satisfactorily. The Corporation accepted a donation of Rs. 42,500 from Mr. Purushotham Bajaj for the construction of a Girls' High School in Gandhinagar.

GLOWING TRIBUTE

Special attention was paid for laying as many gardens as possible in different parts of the City.

Mr. Seetharam had arranged also a Press Conference at Thippagondanahalli, an ideal beauty spot, 20 miles from here.

Mr. N. Keshava Iyengar, M.P. and a former Mayor of Bangalore, was among the distinguished guests.
