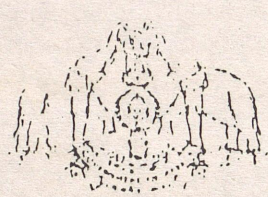

ORDER

In the circumstances reported by the Chief Conservator of Forest (Wildlife), in his letter read above, Government are pleased to constitute the two Committees namely People's Advisory Committee for relocation and Executive Committee for relocation of willing families from interiors of Wayanad Sanctuary. PEOPLE'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR RELOCATION

2. Shri K.K.Ramachandran Master, M.L.A., Kalpetta.
3. Smt.K.Radha Raghavan, M.L.A., Mananthavady.
4. District Panchayat President
5. Concerned Block Panchayath President
6. Concerned Grama Panchayath President.
7. Local NGO's (DISCA, Wayanad Chapter, Asian Elephant Research and Conservation Center, Bangalore, Waynad Prakrithi Samrakshana Samithi)
8. One Range Officer, each from Wayanad Wildlife Division, Wayanad North Division, Wayanad South Division.

DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS

1. Develop criteria for relocation, prioritise the enclosure /settlement to be relocated in a phased manner and prepare rehabilitation plan.
2. Build consensus and obtain willingness from the residents of enclosures /settlements to be relocated and constitute Local Committees.(6-8 Elected representatives of each settlement)
3. Develop package for compensation in consultation with Local Committees (the compensation package for tribals, revenue enclosures and lease holders may be developed separately)

Inspect the land selected by the Executive Committee for relocation and obtain consent of site from the Local Committee of the enclosure/Settlement intended to be relocated.

5. To monitor the rehabilitation programme closely and co-ordinate the process and progress of development by persuading other online departments to undertake development programmes specifically for the rehabilitated families.
6. To ensure the prevention of land dispossession by overseeing the progress of the post rehabilitation stage.


DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS

1. To finalise the legalities in the exchange of land, including the extent of land to be given to each family at the relocated site.
2. Alternative land selection for relocation, getting the acceptance of site by Local Committees through the People's Committee.
3. To review and approve compensation package developed by the people's Committee and obtain Govt. sanction wherever necessary.
4. To review resettlement and rehabilitation plan prepared by the People's Committee and prepare relocation project in a phased manner, obtain clearance under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for forest land.
5. To ensure the demolition of vacated houses and conversion of the vacated land to natural forest/plantations swiftly to avoid their reoccupation etc.
6. Move for notification for declaring the land vacated as forest land and as part of sanctuary area.
7. Oversee and Co-ordinate the progress of development and consolidation of the settlement for a period of 5 years.



O R D E R

Pursuant to legal opinion that Kerala is free to
proceed with their own Projects in the Kabani Basin with State
funding, the Chief Engineer (Investigation), in his letters
read above, had forwarded proposals for important projects
envisaged in this Basin, that would be beneficial to the State,
the details of which are as given under:-

(a) Project for implementation

Banasurasagar Project

Total cost Rs. 37.88 crore (including cost
sharing with the Kerala State Electricity Board to this tune
of Rs. 2.24 crore.).

(b) Projects for Investigation

1. Chundalipuzha Irrigation Project

Cost of construction - Rs. 30 crore (approx.)
Cost of detailed investigation - Rs. 30 lakh (approx.)

2. Kallampathy Irrigation Project

Cost of construction - Rs. 40 crore .
Cost of detailed investigation - Rs. 40 lakh .

3. Kadamanthodu Irrigation Project

Cost of construction - Rs. 30 crore.
Cost of detailed investigation- Rs. 25 lakh.

4. Cheghat Irrigation Project

Cost of construction - Rs. 25 crore (approx.)
Cost of detailed investigation- Rs. 25 lakh (approx.).

5. Noolpuzha Irrigation Project

Cost of construction - Rs. 40 crore (approx.)
Cost of investigation- Rs. 30 lakh (approx.).

(c) Expenditure for procurement of survey and other investments - Rs. 20 lakh

All the above projects except Banasurasagar, require detailed investigation and Project Report formulation. This requires an expenditure of Rs. 170 lakh which include facilities to be created for the purpose including establishment of two sub divisions. The works related to the completion of the canal systems of the Banasurasagar Irrigation Project have to be commenced with State funding to the tune of Rs. 37.88 crores.

Government, after detailed examination, found that it would be in Kerala's larger interest to immediately commence the implementation of the Banasurasagar Project and the detailed investigation of the other 5 Projects and are therefore pleased to accord sanction as detailed hereunder:

(1) For the commencement of the Banasurasagar Project with State funding to the tune of Rs. 37.88 crore (Rupees thirty seven crore and eighty eight lakh only) including the cost sharing with the Kerala State Electricity Board to the tune of Rs. 2.24 crore (Rupees two crore and twenty four lakh only). Funds for this will be provided in the next year's Plan Budget.

(2) For commencing detailed investigation and Project formulation of the following 5 schemes in Kabani Basin, at a total cost of Rs. 170 lakh meeting the expenditure from the head of Account '4701-80-800-94', viz,

(1) Chundalipuzha;

- (2) Kallampathy;
- (3) Kadamanthodu;
- (4) Cheghat;
- (5) Noolpuzha.

The Chief Engineer (I&A) will take immediate necessary steps for inclusion of the amount for the item No. (1) above in the next year's budget.
