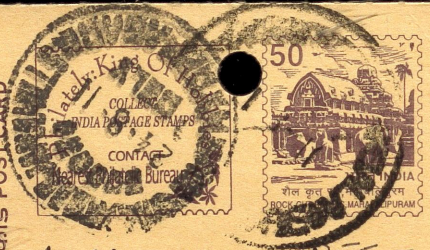


I used to receive quite a few postcards for the NLBW, and some containing valuable information.
