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Additional work to be carried out in the second phase of the 'Multivariate analysis People of India Project'

(i) The districtwise distribution of communities compiled from 1981 and 1931 censuses is being analysed for finding out the range of spread of communities. These ranges will be used as additional inputs for the multivariate analysis.

(ii) Software to facilitate quick access to textual POI data is being developed. This would allow retrieval based on one or more key-words. This will be extremely useful for validation and verification of the results obtained from the multivariate analysis.

(iii) Extent of VARIATION (in terms of the number of traits reported) is being determined for different groups of communities (Religious categories, Constitutional categories etc.) within states as well as at the All-India level. This is being done for all the 776 traits, as well as for each of the 14 classes of traits (social divisions, marriage, impact of developmental programmes etc.) seperately.

(iv) Extent of SHARING (in terms of the average number of traits reported by a pair of communities) is also being determined for different groups of communities (Religious categories, Constitutional categories etc.) within states as well as at the All-India level. This is being done for all the 776 traits, as well as for each of the 14 classes of traits (social divisions, marriage, impact of developmental programmes etc.) seperately. Average similarity (in terms of the percentage of traits shared), and the distribution of similarity values is being computed for both within groups as well as between pairs of groups.
