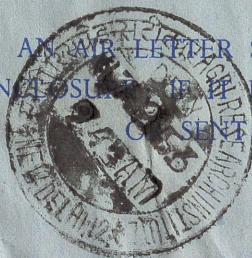

Dear Mr. Ramachandran,

As you might have learnt from my letter to Dr. Krishnan early last month, we reached here safely on the evening of January 6. I have started attending my college here from the day it opened, i.e. on the 10th January. You will find all the details about my work here, etc. in my second letter to Dr. Krishnan which I have written to him only yesterday.

I did not expect to get any reply to my first letter to Dr. K.S.K. as there was nothing in it for him to reply to - it was just a short one informing him of our safe arrival here, and one or two other minor things, as you must know yourself. However, I would very much like to have a reply to my second one written yesterday. You will yourself realise why on reading it. May I take the liberty of troubling you, even from this distance, to remind Dr. K.S.K. as and when you think proper, about replying to it if he does not himself remember about it? Another thing - would it be possible for you kindly to inform me of the programme of

Dr. K.S.K. for visiting U.K. in the near future? Please do excuse me for the trouble I am putting you to. I hope you will not mind it.

In case he is coming to London very shortly, please give him my home-address here given above (phone: CHISWICK 5985 - but only upto 9 a.m. and after 6 p.m. as I am away at the college during the interval) and also my college address which is - Electrical Engg. Dept., City & Guilds College, Exhibition Rd., London, S.W.7, so that he can send me a message where and when I can see him in London. I am requesting you to do this as I have just now heard a rumour that he is coming to London sometime this month, and as I am afraid that there may not be enough time left for me to receive a reply to this before he arrives here. Otherwise I hope to hear from you regarding his programming here and also the name of the hotel where he will stay.

When we came here in January it was not very cold, and we did not find it unpleasant. However, this month, we have been having bitterly cold
