Though I tried to contact you, to call on you and convey my thanks for what all you have done, it was not possible as I was feeling myself quite busy till the last moment and I was called suddenly on account of urgent work to be attended to at this end. I once again thank you very much for all you have done and which could not have been done by other people.

I have received from Dr. Krishnan his recommendations regarding the pay for the European staff. Dr. Krishnan told me that he was sending you a copy of his recommendations. You may remember having told me at Trichinopoly that you will be requesting Dr. Krishnan to make his recommendations and that you will accept the same. I presume that his recommendations are acceptable to you, and I am moving the Council in the matter to give effect to the revised scale from 1st April, --which will naturally mean a higher deficit figure under Recurring for 1953-54.

Revised constitution of the Council

Government of India have revised the constitution of the All India Council for Technical Education with effect from 29th April 1952. The revised constitution of the Council is given below for information of members:

Government of India will deputise for him.
- (b) Educational Adviser to the Government of India.
- (c) Representatives of the Ministries and Departments
of the Government of India.
- (d) Two members of the House of People elected by it.
- (e) One member of the Council of State elected by it.
- (f) One representative of each of the Part (A) and
Part (B) States.
- (g) Eight representatives of Industry and Commerce to
be nominated by organisations approved by the
Government of India.
- (h) Four representatives of Labour to be nominated by
organisations approved by the Government of India.
- (i) One member of the Central Advisory Board of
Education.
- (j) One member of the Inter-University Board of India.
- (k) One representative of the Association of
Principals of Technical Institutions in India.
- (l) Two representatives of Professional Bodies.
- (m) Not more than two members nominated by the
Government of India to represent other interests.

Constitution of the Co-ordinating Committee
Proposals.

The Co-ordinating Committee of the Council was appointed by a Resolution passed by the Council at its first meeting held in April-May, 1946. The life of the first Co-ordinating Committee constituted there-under, expired on the 30th June, 1949, and that of the second on 30th June 1952. In April 1952, the Constitution of the Council was changed reducing its membership from 66 to 47. The Chairman of the Council decided that the old Committee may continue to function till its constitution was reviewed by the re-constituted Council.

The Council's Resolution passed at its first meeting in 1949 provides for 20 members on the Co-ordinating Committee as follows:-

1. Chairman of the Council Ex-officio
2. Educational Adviser of the Government Ex-officio
3. Six Chairmen of the Board of Studies of the Council Ex-officio
9. One member elected by Government of India representatives on the Council.
10. One member elected by Parliament Members on the Council.
- 11-14. Four members elected by State representatives, one from each region.
- 15-16. Two members of elected, one each by the representatives of Employers and Employees on the Council.
17. One member elected by representatives of C.A.B.E. and Inter-University Board on the Council.
18. One member elected by the representatives of Professional bodies like A.P.T.I., Institution of Engineers etc.
- 19-20. Two members nominated by the Chairman of the Council from amongst the members of the Council to represent interests not otherwise adequately represented.

Since the passing of the Resolution, two Regional Committees of the Council have been formed and two more are expected to come into being shortly. It is necessary to provide for.
