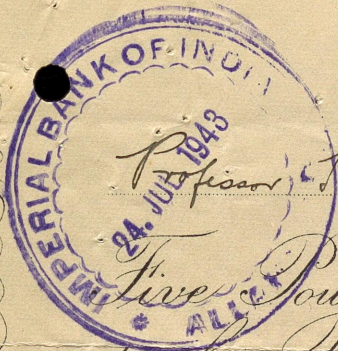

Sir,

I am desired by the Council to direct your attention to Statute 23 of the Statutes of the Royal Society wherein it is laid down that every person elected a Fellow of the Society, before he is admitted, shall pay the admission fee of £10 and the first annual contribution of £5, or the admission fee of £10 and the life composition payment of £75. If admission be deferred beyond June all payments must be made not later than 30 September next following the date of election.

It would greatly facilitate the accounting of the Society's funds if the annual contribution, payable in future on 25 March of each year, were paid by means of a Banker's Order. Below is such an order form in the event of your being willing to adopt this course: it should be returned to the Society for registration.

NOTICE

This is the last number of the publication "Monthly Science News," which in future will be replaced by a publication called *British Science News*. It is intended that this publication should be larger than "Monthly Science News" and contain some longer and more specialised authoritative articles. It will contain also some book reviews and other items of general interest such as particulars of British Scientific Conferences.

The first number of *British Science News* will appear in July, 1947, and will be a special Chemistry number associated with the Centenary Celebrations of the Chemical Society.

Although this first number will deal mainly with the history and development of chemistry, future numbers will not be restricted in scope, but should appeal to the general scientific reader, and enable a worker in one branch of science to understand and appreciate developments in other branches.

It is regretted that the ever-growing demand for *Monthly Science News* has made it impracticable to adopt a policy of free distribution for the new publication.

The subscription rate for *British Science News* will be 5s. for 12 numbers (6d. per copy) in the United Kingdom, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand and \$1.0 (10 cents per copy) in the United States and Canada, including postage. Payment by cheque, postal order or international money order should be made to The British Council, 3, Hanover Street, London, W.1.

In countries other than those named above the subscription rate will be the approximate equivalent of 5s. per annum in the currency of the country concerned.

If difficulty is experienced in sending the necessary currency please inform the Publication Manager of your requirements on the form below. It is hoped that it will be possible to make suitable arrangements for the distribution of *British Science News* in your area, either through a British Council Representative or through appointed agents. Copies of *British Science News* will be distributed free of charge to certain selected libraries, institutes, colleges and schools.



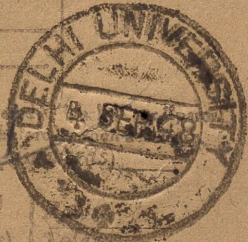
