

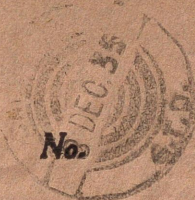

On 15 June, 1961, when I first learned of the death of your husband, I wrote you as follows:


"I read with sorrow in this morning's New York Times of the death of your beloved husband. Dr. Krishnan was one of my old and dear friends and I cannot tell you how the news grieves me. He was a great and good man and the world is poorer for his loss.

"You may not have known this, but some years ago Dr. Krishnan on leaving the United States had a few dollars left over which he asked me to hold for him. He had drawn on this balance from time to time but there is still a balance of \$34.02. I am accordingly enclosing a check in this amount, made payable to 'Mrs. K. S. Krishnan'. I hope you will have no difficulty in cashing this check".

To date the cancelled check has not been returned to us and I am wondering whether it ever reached you. The check was #480 drawn on the account of "I. Fankuchen, Special" at the Chemical Bank New York Trust Company, 50 Court Street (Borough Hall), Brooklyn, N.Y. May I hear from you on this matter.

May I again offer my condolences and my wishes for your good health.
