which I received on 20-8-81.

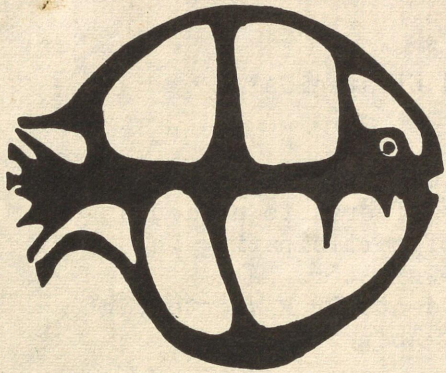
I wish to draw your kind attention to the fact that I

## NEWSLETTER AUGUST 1981

### DELAYS IN JOURNAL CIRCULATION

Many members have been experiencing problems of protracted delay in receiving the journals to which they are entitled, and in some cases none of the current years issues have been received at all. The problem mainly involves new members, members who have recently changed address or those who have had their journal circulation temporarily withdrawn due to late payment. The problem has arisen because Academic Press failed to act on any instructions regarding membership subscriptions supplied to them by the Secretary since December 1980. Hopefully the problems have now all been ironed out. A **letter** from the Subscriptions Manager of Academic Press of June 5 includes the following:-

"I have now managed to ensure that all additions, deletions and changes of address have been noted and that all amendments are completely up to date. I realise that I should not make excuses for the poor service you have been receiving, however the department has been, and still is, under great pressure as the volume of work is enormous."

If any members are still not receiving their copies of the Journal they should inform the Secretary, and not deal directly with Academic Press.

### MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY

#### a. AGM and meeting on 'Practical aspects of fish tracking'

December 9 and 10 1981, at the Central Electricity Research Laboratory, Leatherhead.

The AGM will take place at about 1630 on December 9. The scientific meeting is tentatively scheduled to run from 1030 am on December 9, and to end at lunchtime the following day. It will deal with practical problems of tracking fish using acoustic and radio tags, including supplies of equipment, performance, experimental design, methods of tagging, logistics of tracking and drawbacks of the approach. It is hoped that manufacturers will provide displays and advertising material, and that groups actively engaged in tracking work will demonstrate their equipment in the pool at the Laboratory. Accommodation is not being provided, but lists of local hotels will be supplied on request. Full details of the programme and of the AGM will be provided in the next newsletter in early October.
