Dear Sir:

This has reference to Mr. Manmohan Singh, a Case of Chronic Myelocytic Leukaemia presently being treated at the Tata Memorial Hospital.


This Case has been referred to us for investigations as to the cause of abnormal red cell morphology and hypercellular bone marrow with normoblastic erythropoiesis seen in him. Our preliminary investigations indicate a detailed family study of this Case. I, therefore, request you to arrange to collect 3-4 ml. of blood from his parents and his other sblings (brothers and sisters of the patient) in the containers already sent to the party. They contain EDTA as anticoagulant and hence needs careful mixing to prevent coagulation. If possible, please send two blood smears from each.

I have already instructed the party to approach you with the necessary family members to have the blood specimens collected. These samples are to be carefully labelled and wrapped in polythene bag and placed in a wide-mouthed thermos flask and sent to us with minimum delay. Blood smears may be wrapped in paper and then again in polythene bag and placed between the cork and the outer lid of the thermos to prevent the smears from getting lysed. Mr. Inderjit Singh, the brother of the patient, will contact you with this letter who in turn will arrange to despatch this by air cargo.

I shall be grateful for your cooperation and hope to be excused for the trouble.
