Dear Senator Jeffords,

We the undersigned, attendees at a meeting of Tiger Link in Delhi on 1-3 December 1997, would like to express our deep concern over the continuing sale of Chinese medicines labelled as containing tiger parts in the USA. We thank you for taking this issue seriously and fully support your "Rhino and Tiger Product Labeling Act" which would effectively close the loopholes currently existing in the Endangered Species Act.

In India, there are many people trying very hard to protect the remaining wild tigers and rhinos. Field staff often risk their lives under fire from poachers. It is extraordinary to us that US legislation still fails to give your wildlife enforcement officers the tools they need to stamp out trade in these animals.

We are aware of the recent resolution adopted at CITES in June 1997 which called on "All Parties and non-Parties, especially tiger range and consumer States to adopt comprehensive legislation and enforcement controls as a matter of urgency, with the aim of eliminating trade in tiger parts and derivatives, in order to demonstrably reduce the illegal trade in tiger parts and derivatives by the 11th meeting of the Conference of the Parties."

We thank you for your concern and look forward to speedy passage of your Act.





Dear Mr Hepworth,

We the undersigned, attendees at a meeting of Tiger Link in Delhi on 1-3 December 1997, would like to express our deep concern over the continuing sale of Chinese medicines labelled as containing tiger parts in New York, Amsterdam, Tokyo and Yokohama. A recent survey of these cities demonstrated the continuing failure of wealthy developed nations to stamp out this trade.

As Chair of the Standing Committee of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) we ask you to explain what measures you intend to take to eliminate trade in tiger parts and derivatives. National legislation in countries such as the USA and Japan fail to provide their enforcement agencies with the tools to achieve this goal and enforcement in countries such as the Netherlands is lacking.

We ask you to deal with consumption of tiger parts with the greatest priority. It is demoralising for those working so hard in field conservation in tiger habitat to learn that wealthier countries are failing to take the plight of the highly endangered tiger seriously. Many forest guards in India frequently risk their lives to protect the forest and wildlife in their charge.

We draw your attention to the resolution adopted at CITES in June 1997 which called on "All Parties and non-Parties, especially tiger range and consumer States to adopt comprehensive legislation and enforcement controls as a matter of urgency, with the aim of eliminating trade in tiger parts and derivatives, in order to demonstrably reduce the illegal trade in tiger parts and derivatives by the 11th meeting of the Conference of the Parties."

We look forward to receiving your response at the address below.
