To overcome the language barrier - the articles in the Kalki will all be in Tamil - and to help you to follow them week by week, I am arranging to send you every Thursday for the duration of the symposium a summarised version in English of the articles that appear in that week, in the form of a Press summary.

I am sure you would appreciate the role that the Kalki is playing in educating public opinion and the high place that it occupies amongst the reading public. I would very much value your reactions to the series of articles that appear in the Kalki on this important subject.

Dear Sr. Krishnan,

With the current week's issue of the Kalki, the symposium on Co-operative Farming, Ceilings on land, and State Trading is concluded. Starting from the issue dated August 2, 1959, it has now run for full eight weeks.

Altogether 24 articles have appeared in this symposium, at an average of three articles a week, all contributed by personages each eminent in his sphere and well qualified to discuss this subject. Practical farmers confirmed co-operators, successful administrators and mature thinkers have spoken unreservedly to laybare the pitfalls that beset the path of the new experiment.

I believe, barring the official view and the communist view between which there is not much of a difference, the public reaction to this topical subject has been fairly exhaustively set forth.

You should have doubtless been following these articles, either in the Kalki or through the abridged summaries in English which we have been sending you week by week.
