

Applications are invited for the post of Director, Central Salt Research Institute, Bhavnagar (Saurashtra) India, in the scale of Rs.2000-100-2500. A higher initial salary can be given to an exceptionally qualified candidate.

My dear Professor Thacker,

The Atomic Energy Conference at Geneva and the Pugwash Conference at Kitzbuhel and Vienna went off very well. There was close collaboration between the scientists from all the countries. I reached London last night and shall be leaving for Washington this afternoon.

I am sorry for the delay in replying to your telegram. The Academy papers were with me, and I have posted them to-day by the Diplomatic bag. I shall contact Bronk, Trytten and Atwood, and also Colby and cable to you from Washington.

I understand that some major changes are under contemplation, in CSIR by way of additional personnel. I would like any changes contemplated, at the NPL, at any rate, to be postponed till after my return to Delhi.

Mr. Baliga asked me whether we could agree to Mr. Ramamurti's acting as Technical Consultant to BEL; I would like to agree to this proposal, if a Technical Development Cell is set up by BEL at the NPL, for this purpose and Ramamurti continues to work in Delhi. I see no objection to his going to Bangalore occasionally if necessary.
