My dear Dr. Krishnan,

Dr. S. Venkateswaran tells me that you would be leaving for abroad by the end of this month and that you would be away from India for nearly a month.

2. You would recollect my personal request to you while at Delhi to inform me of the official reply of the Atomic Energy Commission to my questionnaire on the subject of Atomic Energy Patents. I have not received any reply from Mr. Nanjappa or from Dr. Bhabha. I am enclosing a copy of a letter addressed by the Prime Minister to Mr. Ranganathan, Secretary, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, regarding the urgency of the revision of the Patents Law. In view of this, the preparation of the Report is being expedited and I desire to get it ready as early as possible. It is, therefore, all the more urgent that I should have a reply from the Atomic Energy Commission at a very early date to enable me to get through this job expeditiously. I have written to Mr. Nanjappa reminding him of his previous reply. But unless you take a personal interest in the matter, it might be difficult for the Commission to consider my proposals and forward their reactions in view of their preoccupations with the other important matters.

3. I shall, therefore, thank to communicate to me the views of the Commission
