Dear Dr. Bahadur,

As this is the first letter I have written to you, may I take this opportunity of congratulating you on your award.

Thank you for your letter of 1st October from which I note that it may take a few months before you are able to arrive in this country. From the Foundation's point of view, it is essential that you spend a minimum of ten months actually in the United Kingdom. I have telephoned Professor James and told him that there is no chance of your being able to arrive by the beginning of the term, which of course started to-day.

With reference to the question of living accommodation, I am afraid it is absolutely no use trying to arrange for a flat before you reach London, unless you have friends here who are in a position to choose one for you. No agent will deal with anyone until they have been to his office to register in person. This means in effect that if you have no friends or relations here to take this responsibility for you, you and your family will need hotel accommodation for a week or more while you look round. The alternative would be for you to come ahead of your family and for them to join you when you have found suitable accommodation for them.

If you refer to the second paragraph on page 2 of Mr. Farrer-Brown's letter you will see that we cannot allow you to collect the passage money for your wife and yourself from the Foundation. As this could be a contravention of Indian currency regulations the only circumstances under which I could get authority to pay you this money in the United Kingdom would be if you could let me have a letter from the Federal Bank of India authorising the Foundation to do so on your behalf.



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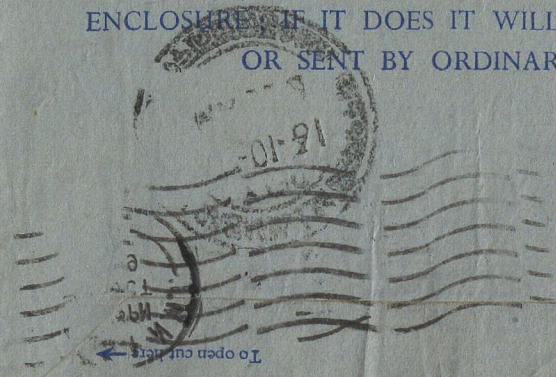

Dear Dr. Bahadur,

Thank you for your letter of the 18th October, letting us know that you are arranging your passage through Messrs. Cook & Son Ltd., in Bombay. Will you please ask them to send their account for the return fares, for yourself and your wife, to their London office so that we can settle the bill here. You need not make the actual bookings for your return journey unless you wish to, but we do need to pay the deposit for the return tickets now.

I am sorry that the Indian Government cannot let you know until shortly before you leave whether they will allow you sufficient money to enable you to bring your children with you. I am sure you are pressing them for as early a decision as possible and I should be glad to hear from you as soon as you know anything definite. In the meantime I am pleased to be able to tell you that another of the Foundation's flats will become vacant in April, if you would like to have it. It has two bedrooms, one of them very small, but just large enough for the two children if they can sleep on a double berth bed - i.e. one above the other, like a ship's cabin. This arrangement has proved to be very satisfactory with other Fellows children in our flats with similar accommodation. Please let me know straight away whether you would like to take advantage of the offer of this flat, assuming that your children will be accompanying you, so that we can reserve it for you.

Perhaps I should warn you that no assistance is available for cleaning the flat, so I am afraid it will be a full-time job for you wife to do this, cook and cope with the children. I mention this because I gathered from your letter that she may wish to spend a good deal of her time doing academic work.

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
