Dear Dr Krishnan,

A report has come to me that Unesco is soon sending an expert to "help in the establishment of 3 science museums in India, primarily in Delhi, and also in Calcutta and Bombay." The one in Delhi is to be in the National Physical Laboratory and will primarily be scientific in character. The others in Bombay and Calcutta will be scientific, but emphasizing the technological and applied aspects of science and technology."

Should the unit at the NPL be devoted not exclusively to higher branches of physics, but will have displays for public education in science in general. I would pray to you for your favourable consideration of my case while recruiting the staff for the proposed science museum. I remember that you were firm that any exhibition or display at the NPL would concentrate on the research aspects of the exhibits for the benefit of the research workers in physics only. It is probable that there has been revision of the ideas formulating the Museum.

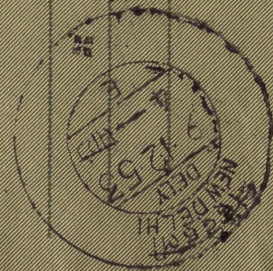
