Dear Dr. Swaminathan:

In the January issue of CEREAL SCIENCE TODAY, we read with very great interest that your institute had announced the discovery of a new strain of wheat that contains 5% lysine in its protein. Mr. Suresh K. Sinha, an Indian graduate student in our department, suggested that I write you for available information on this high lysine strain of wheat such as protein content, pedigree, class of wheat and any other pertinent information.

Our ultimate goal here is the development of hard red spring and durum wheats that are not nutritionally deficient in lysine or other amino acids but still have the desired milling, mixing, baking and pasta properties found in North Dakota wheats. We are analyzing lines and varieties of wheat as well as a number of different wheat species but have not yet found any with lysine as high as reported by you. Our research would be greatly facilitated if your strain of wheat could be used in breeding high lysine into our good quality varieties. Would a small sample of your high lysine strain of wheat be available to us at a later date?

Congratulations on your very important discovery. We will be looking forward to hearing from you.

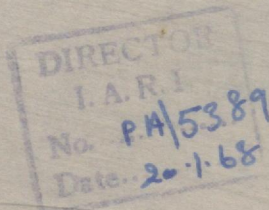



The seeds of Sonora 64 were irradiated and the M_1 was grown at Delhi during 1963-64. The M_2 population comprising 48,500 plants was grown at Delhi and amber mutants were isolated. During 1965 the isolated mutants were grown as M_3 at Wellington, Nilgiris, and a large number of plants with the desirable grain colour ~~was~~ were selected.

The M_4 material was grown in Delhi during 1965-66 and all the promising lines were bulked into six families and further multiplication of the seed was done at Wellington during 1966.

During 1966-67, all the six families were tested at Delhi for their yield potential and on the basis of a trial and the data of multiplication-cum-demonstration plots, a high yielding strain was released and named as Sharbati Sonora.

The seeds were also multiplied at Wellington during 1967 and the produce was passed on to the National Seeds Corporation.



I thank you very much for your kind letter.


I am sure you are fully aware of the area that was sown under Sonora Sharbati 64 at our Farm. The seed which we received was shrivelled and had a very gappy germination. Sowing of this plot was done as late as 21st December 1966. The total of this variety seed sown was about 30 kilos. The crop was rogued three times by your staff including Dr. Virgheese and Shri Amir Singh. Bundles & bundles of off type plants were removed from this field each time, thus leaving a very poor plant stand. At the time of maturity, this being the last crop in the field, there was heavy damage by birds.

We have presently about 250 kilos of this variety and this we would like to multiply directly at our Farm and I am contacting the National Seeds Corporation to register our Farm as the contract grower for this variety. However, I am also arranging to send to you, directly, 100 kilos with our compliments.

We also have about 400 kilos of Sharbati Sonora 63, which could be made available to you.

I hope this has cleared up the whole position.







Dear Dr. Swaminathan,

Kindly refer to your D.O. No.PA/TS/5024 dated 13th November, 1967 regarding purchase of wheat seed from Jawahar Jounti Cooperative Society Ltd.. As you are already aware that this Cooperative Society has been contacted a number of times since the beginning, but they have not given us any seed on one pretext or another. The matter has been discussed with you also a number of times. The Assistant Registrar Cooperative Societies and the Agriculture Officer, Delhi have also gone to the village a number of times but with no result.

When the Rabi sowings are almost now over, this Society has proposed to give only about 50 mds. of seed as against a quota of 400 mds. already fixed by you. In spite of this, the Agriculture Officer was sent to purchase the seed but the seed shown by the members was not true to the quality. This Society has already sold the wheat seed in large quantities to the farmers of adjoining States on very high prices. This Department is not in a position to purchase sub-standard seed of low quality a part of which is weevilled. This seed is not the original produce of the cultivators as they have collected it from other sources under pressure to offer to the Department and therefore it is not reliable.

Dear Dr. Swaminathan,

Please refer to my letter dated 11th September which was acknowledged, in your absence, by your Technical Secretary Shri P. L. Guglani - vide letter dated 20th/21st September 1967.

Now that you have returned from abroad, I hope you will be able to attend to my request for supplying the latest varieties of seed for my farm at Panipat. I particularly require as much seed as possible of S.227 and Sherbti Senora 64. If you can kindly supply or carry on experiment at my farm with triple gene dwarf strain, I shall be obliged and shall be happy to provide all facilities to your staff and carry out instructions given by your technical people. I may inform you that I am a keen farmer and before the Partition, my farm had been supplying seed to the Agriculture Department and the cotton botanists carried on experiments on my farm regarding long staple varieties for which all facilities were provided by me. Even after the Partition, the small farm that I have got at Panipat is a mechanized farm and is being supervised by an experienced technical hand who is a B.Sc. Agriculture of the Punjab University. Before my appointment as Governor, I was myself properly supervising the farm also although the technical manager was employed. Even from this farm I have been supplying seed to the Agriculture Department of the Punjab.

Your Institute is carrying on very useful experiments and has evolved high yielding varieties of wheat and millets. But perhaps advantage has been taken mostly by a few farmers in Delhi State. My farm is not far from Delhi, being only 56 miles from that place and is very well situated just opposite the G.T. Road towards the south. 



Dear Dr. Mehta,

I am sure you have received by now nearly 30 quintals of wheat seed from our Karnal Station. This seed is of very good quality showing excellent germination percentage, and it is therefore advisable that farmers are advised to dibble it at the rate of 10 kg. per acre. We have already supplied you written literature in this regard.

We have also given to the N.S.C. earlier this week nearly 27 quintals of wheat seed from our Wellington Substation, where an off-season crop was raised. I have already informed you that we can give you another 5 quintals or so of material received from Wellington. As you know, the off-season wheat crop is affected to some extent in the viability of its seed, and it cannot be comparable with the crop raised in the main season. I expect, therefore, that the viability of the Wellington seed will be significantly less than that of the Karnal seed. In view of this, I have two recommendations to make, which may please be given due consideration. First, the Wellington seed should be treated with a suitable fungicide so that the seeds are free of fungal organisms during germination. Secondly, I suggest that the farmers should be asked to dibble two seeds per hole rather than one seed, as is the normal practice and as can be done in the case of the Karnal seed. I feel this increased seed rate is necessary because in the absence of this, the farmers may fail to raise a good crop from the Wellington seed.



This is a follow-up to our telephone conversation yesterday concerning supply of Sharbati Sonora seed for the coordinated agronomic experiments. I have gone over our list of experiments to determine how much seed is required prior to November. Some time ago when I had enquired about the quantities of seeds of Sherbati Sonora with you, which you had multiplied on our behalf under the supervision of Dr. George Varughese, you told me that the seeds had not yet been graded. So far I have made an allocation of one ton to the Delhi Administration from this quantity. I hope the seeds have been graded by now and kindly let me know the actual quantity available with you. You can keep the quantity required for your own use and the rest will be taken over by the N.S.C. for multiplication. It has been decided by the ICAR that the NSC will do all the multiplication of varieties produced by the ICAR Institutes. I am enclosing copies of this letter to Shri Iqbal Singh, Development Commissioner and Shri J. Veeraraghavan, Secretary and C.A.O., NSC, to contact you and take delivery of the seeds.
