THE DEPARTMENT of Geology, Panjab University, is organising a short course on 'Paleoseismology and Earthquake Geology' from October 8 to 11. Around 20 participants from various geological organisations and universities are expected to attend.

The faculty includes eminent scientists from the Centre of Earth Studies, Thiruvananthapuram, Geological Survey of India, Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology and Panjab Univer-

sity. Naresh Kochhar, the course coordinator, informed that the course will be followed by a two-day field trip to Renuka and adjoining areas.

The course will be inaugurated by Dr R.P. Bajpai, director, CSIO, Chandigarh, and will be presided over by Prof Raj Hans-Gill, dean, University Instructions, PU.

The week-long course will be held in ICSSR Complex Hall, PU. It assumes significance in view of the fact that the Chandigarh-Nada-Morni areas have witnessed neotectonic activities in recent times.
