
Dear Mr. Sukumaran,

Dear Miss Koopman,

I arrived here and have resumed duty. I am slowly settling down to my work. I am sorry for not writing to you earlier. I hope you had a nice holiday and that you are back fit and fresh.

This is just to inform you that I am very grateful to you and the authorities of the NEBUTA for affording me an opportunity to work in Groningen under Prof. Jonxis. I must say that I am greatly benefited by the training I received in his laboratory and could learn the latest techniques using most modern equipments for the type of work in which I am presently interested. First few months of my stay in that laboratory was utilized in getting to know the various work carried out there and to learn the upto-date techniques. Very soon with the help and co-operation of Prof. Jonxis and his staff I could take up some problems to work independently. This has resulted in some interesting findings. Needless to say that the knowledge I acquired during my fellowship period would be usefully utilized in the furtherance of my work in this country in the field of hereditary haemolytic anaemias. This, as you know, is one of the major hurdles in anaemias in children in our country.

Besides what I have learned in the Department of Pediatrics, the "Get-together" and other social functions arranged by NEBUTA and other organizations have added immensely to my knowledge of the life in the Netherlands. The industrial progress and the land reclamation projects besides the social and cultural advancements of the country have left a lasting impression in my mind. The extreme cordiality with which I was treated wherever I went in your country have left happy memories which I shall cherish always.

Please convey my kind regards to Mr. Waber, Mr. Han and other colleagues of yours. I do hope I shall have an occasion to meet you again some time.
