The Information Service of India has received a request from an organisation called "The Foundation For Integrated Education, Inc." of which the Executive Vice President is one Mr. F.L.Kunz, who was the Principal of the Buddhist College, Ceylon for a number of years - for an article by some eminent Indian scientist for the September issue of the journal "Main Currents In Modern Thought", a considerable part of which they have decided to devote to "matters philosophical and educational in connection with India". In one of his letters Mr. Kunz has said : "Many of us are convinced that the essential elements upon which all the darsanas agree, are true of nature and therefore, would serve to make modern science much more meaningful. I have in mind such an item as the anticipation of resonance theory in the notion of the akasha in the Nyaya - Vaishesika. There are, of course, many other examples." Mr. Kunz has further suggested that the writer of the article should represent this point of view.
