It was very kind and good of you to have looked me up at the Constitution House on the 2nd Decr

I passed through Bombay on my ^{way} back to Madras and conveyed your kind message to my son about the 'intestinal flora' treatment in the U.S.A. He has promised to take the treatment if the present one he is having under a German Doctor does not give results

I am naturally worried about his health as he is weak and is working 12 hours a day subsisting on baby foods which alone he is able to take and that too in limited quantities.

He is definitely to leave his present post in the Tata Co as he is disappointed with the manner in which he has been treated by that company. It is a long story but the short of it is that having made marked sacrifices both in finance and in health for starting the Radio industry with the Tata's he finds himself in a position where he has no other go except to leave the concern.

~~When~~ When last he was with me at Madras under going treatment he re-joined the concern after promises by Mr A.D.Shroff to me in writing defining my son's position in the company and paying verbal tribute to my son's work and devotion. Now that the purpose has been served he is to be ~~xxxx~~ ignored. This has been a very sore disappointment to my son at a time when his health is none too good. I am trying to get him to come away to Madras forgetting all these disappointments and devoting all his energy to get really well but I find that without considerable work to do he is not mentally happy. This, I found, when he was last at Madras for treatment and it was this that made me agree to his going back to work in Bombay though yet of poor health.
