My dear Prof. Krishnan,

Prof. Kosambi told me some days back, that he had a discussion with you about the course, Bajirao should follow after his M.Sc., and that you had expressed your willingness to accept him as a research student under your guidance, at Allahabad.

You know the state of mind, in which Bajirao was finding himself. While he was trying to decide upon his future 'plan of action' and I had to give him enough time to think it out for himself. After he had made his final choice, with which I heartily agreed, as it meant the logical fulfilment of whatever scientific training he has got so far, I wired to you during the last week, that he would be joining Allahabad for research by the end of this month. Probably he will

not have too much difficulty in securing  
a scholarship of about \$: 757. Such  
would be enough to meet his current expenses  
there, although this has not and need not  
have weighed with him in making the  
final choice.

I hope, he will be able to make the  
best of the opportunity he is getting of working  
under your personal direction, and in trying  
to develop a permanent and living  
interest in scientific research he may not  
acquit himself too badly.
