My dear Dr. Krishnan,

I was very glad to receive your kind letter of the 5<sup>th</sup> July. I arrived here from Paris on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> and paid a brief visit to Bristol to see the Laboratory and more particularly Powell's work and the low temperature Laboratory.
