This year's Patel Memorial Lecture series, which begins on the anniversary day of Sardar Patel will be delivered by Prof. J. B. S. Haldane, F.R.S. Prof. Haldane has chosen "The Unity and Diversity of Life" as his subject. In the course of the three lectures, Prof. Haldane discusses the application of the concepts of unity and diversity of life not only to plants and animals but also to human life and social

organisations. He analyses some philosophical implications of his views in the context of Indian thought.

Prof. Haldane, the distinguished biologist who has made important contribution to the Science of Genetics, has taught at the Universities of Cambridge and London and has been connected with several learned bodies. He is now associated with the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta.
