Dear Professor Bhagavantam,

Last year I was very sorry that I could not visit India to see you and your Laboratory, though you were so kind to invite me. Now, I shall be despatched to the 7th General Assembly of IUPAP (International Union of Pure and Applied Physics) to be held in July 1951 at Copengagen, as one of the delegates from our Science Council, and I expect to fly via India to Europe near the end of June. After Copengagen I shall probably go to U.S.A. and attend the meeting of the American Chemical Society. If I could have the pleasure to see you and Prof. Krishnan at Hyderabad, I should like to talk with you on the researches in the theory of molecular structure and microwave spectroscopy, theory of electronic states of paramagnetic ions in crystals, etc., which we have been studying in our laboratory. I hope I also to see Prof. Krishnan at Delhi, who you told me, is engaged in researches on paramagnetism of crystals. May I ask you to write to Prof. Krishnan to ask his convenience ?

In the present Japan, the formalities to obtain the permission to visit foreign countries are rather complicated, and I should be very much obliged to you if I could expect your kindness to write me a letter by air mail.

Prof. S. Mizushima, one of my colleagues in our Faculty, has said to me that he is very sorry that he cannot visit Hyderabad according to his schedule of journey; he will leave Japan within several days.
