Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of the office memo no. 3F-ECR-41-DFC dated 22nd February 1956 from the Administrative Officer, Central Electr Chemical Research Institute regarding my application for the extension of leave till the end of December 1956. I have noted with great regret that the Council of Scientific and Industrial research is unable to extend my leave upto the end of December 1956. Fortunately, however, my work is likely to be finished much earlier than December 1956.

According to the rules of the University of London, a candidate for Ph.D. degree has to put in work for full two calendar years before he can submit his thesis. I may be permitted to point out once again that even though my study leave took effect from 19th January 1954, I could not leave India untill the end of May 1954, due to the delay in getting exchange facilities passport and passage and also due to my ill health. This unavoidable delay in joining the studies here, ^{in June 1954, five months after the commencement of my study leave} has forced me to apply for an extension of leave.

I have been working here in the Royal Holloway College under the guidance of Professor S.Tolansky, F.R.S. and in close collaboration with the Tin Research Institute on the hardness and the surface studies of electro deposited alloys by optical and iterferometric techniques. This work is directly connected with my duties in the Central Electro Chemical Research Institute. I am enclosing , herewith, a copy of a letter from Dr. W.E.Hoare, D.Sc., Assistant Director of the Tin Research Institute ~~reg~~ regarding my work.

I shall be highly obliged if the council of Scientific and Industrial Research is pleased to grant me an extension of leave at least until the end of July 1956 and preferably some months longer.

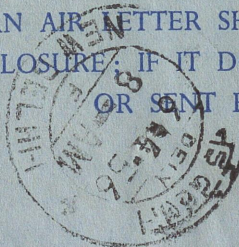
