Dear Prof. Dr. Krishnan,


I enquired after you left from Dr. S. Venkateshwaran about Waller's book and he told me that you had left your copy with him.

Re: the other subject I talked to you: i.e. the spectrograph and monochromator, is it possible to spare for my use here for about a year. I wish to have a spectrograph with two or three prisms i.e. without far too much dispersion and with good light gathering power. As the visible region is being attacked there will be no need to use quartz prisms and lenses. The subsidiary monochromator is to make a preliminary selection in the spectral region. Please let me know whether I should apply officially and to what designation. This latter I shall do if after my applying, objections are not raised.

I expect that you are in the pink of health and spate of activity as usual.
