Dear Dr. Krishnan,

Last Saturday I paid a visit to the London Hospital to see Mr. Ramamurti, and I know that you will welcome some news of his condition, so I am writing you this note.

I found him very cheerful and in good spirits, although he is obviously in some pain, which is to be expected after such a severe operation. He is lying flat on his back, and will have to remain in this position for another seven weeks, ensuring that the neck is not moved in any way. The severe pain he was getting prior to the operation, in his left arm and leg due to pressure on a nerve centre, has now gone.

I had a chat with the Ward Sister in charge, who told me that the surgeons are quite satisfied with the operation, and that his condition is very satisfactory indeed.

Mr. Ramamurti was very pleased to receive your cable, and asked me to thank you for your kind thought.

I trust, Dr. Krishnan, that you are keeping well, and I hope to see you again next time I visit Delhi.

Dear Dr. Krishnan,

I feel I ought to write and tell you the latest news concerning your assistant, Mr. Ramamurti.

Mr. Ramamurti has had to undergo a further operation to relieve the pressure on a nerve centre located in his neck. This operation was a very trying one for him, but I am glad to say that the surgeons are satisfied that the nerve centre is now relieved and that the pain in his right arm should now gradually disappear. During the operation they explored the bone grafts set in the first operation, and pronounced them to be very satisfactory indeed. We are now hoping that Mr. Ramamurti will recover rapidly to full health. He is already out of danger and, when I visited him last Saturday, I found him bright and cheerful although, of course, still in some pain due to the operation.

He tells me that he is rather worried about his long absence from the Laboratory, but will be writing to you himself concerning this matter as soon as he is able to sit up. I feel that in a few weeks he will probably be fit enough to travel back to India.
