 Incidentally it may be noted that although the ionospheric observations
 at Calcutta are being carried out for nearly four years under the auspices
 of the C.S.I.R., the Council has not had, up'till now, to incur any expenditure
 by way of grant for equipment.

I may mention for your information that the automatic ionosphere
 equipment is not usually on sale as they have been developed for making special
 observations during war and the actual cost of constructing one would not be
 less than Rs. 25,000/-.

I shall be thankful if you give the matter your earnest
 consideration.
