Dear Dr. Krishna,

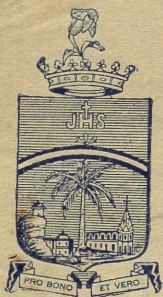
This is to tell you that I have finished with Palanakkal and been transferred here this year. Please drop into my room whenever you pass this side.

December to his boys at Loyola.

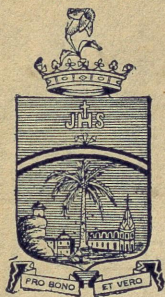
Whenever you pass through

and improvement.

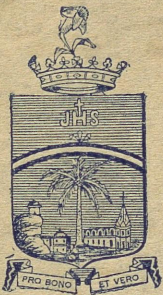
L. J. Narayanaswami (of Assam)

picnic in these hills.

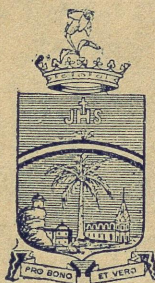
Tiruvadi came to see me

Has M. S. Kishnan returned

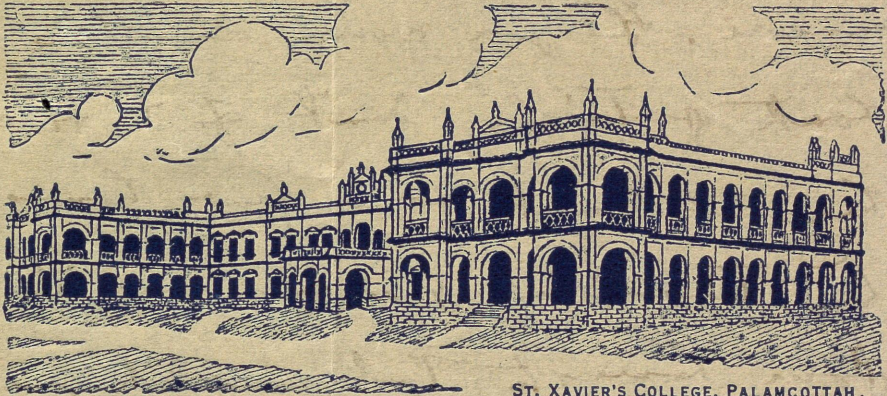
from his excavations?

which no college teachers.

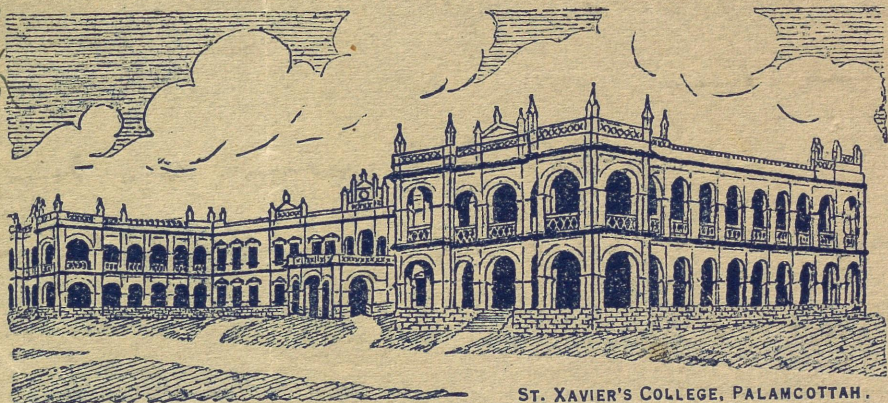

know if you come to Dabra.

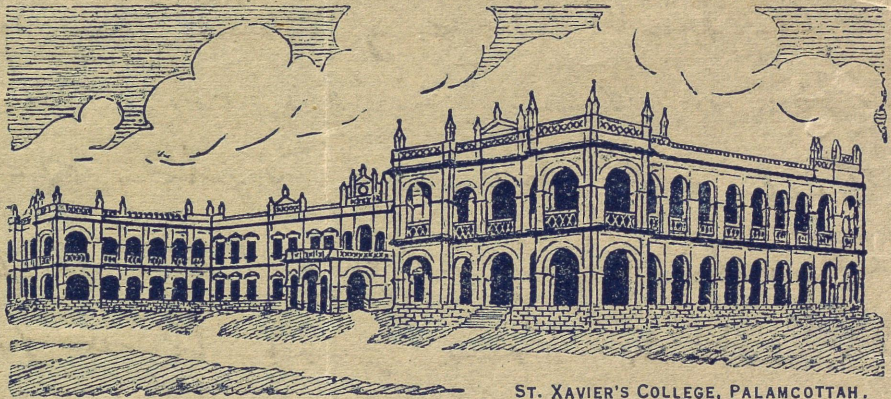
