Dear Dr. Krishnan,

~~This~~ Yesterday morning when I attended the meeting of the Madrasi School I wanted to discuss the matter relating to Mahakratu with you. But you left in a hurry and I could not contact you. In order to avoid any further delay I have sent the enclosed reply and am forwarding a copy of it for your information and for such action as you may think proper.

I wanted also to consider with you another matter. Shri Swamiji of Naimisaranyam came to my residence sometime ago in the course of last week and told me that it is proposed to organise some regular classes of Vaishnavite religious discourses at Karolbagh by taking a room on rent and fixing honorarium for the gentleman who is to conduct the discourses. He said it is proposed to meet the expenses by a monthly contributions. I told him that I would make up my mind about it after discussing the matter with you. Since there is no particular hurry about this I shall discuss the matter with you sometime or other. You may let me know any evening which you may find convenient so that I may go to you for this purpose.

Revered Swamiji,

I am in due receipt of your letter dated the 27th Feb. with the audited statement of accounts and the audit report enclosed. I think the statement and the report are alright and I have no particular comments to offer. The only suggestions I make are the following.

1. There should be a formal meeting of the Central Committee of the Mahakratu at Madras under the Chairmanship of the President, Shri S. Varadachariar, at which both the Secretaries (Shri Swamiji and Shri T.K. Gopalacharyulu) should be present. If considered necessary the auditor, Shri P. Parthasarathi may also be requested to attend the meeting.
2. All the opinions or comments received in reply to the circular letter dated the 27th February to the Members of the Committee should be placed before that Committee Meeting for its consideration.
3. If the accounts are passed on the basis of the audit report and the opinions received, a formal resolution to that effect should be recorded.
4. A further resolution should be recorded that the assets and liabilities along with the statement of accounts and account-books of the Kratu Committee are ~~km km~~ handed over to the Sri Visishtadwaita Pracharaka Sangham and that the same is accepted on behalf of that Sangham by the Secretaries thereof present at the Committee Meeting.
5. Another resolution should be recorded that in view of this transfer, the Kratu Committee has dissolved itself and that the Secretaries are authorised to publish the audited statement of the accounts and to communicate these proceedings to the other members of the Committee.

You may fix up the meeting of the Committee at Madras in consultation with Shri S. Varadachariar on such date and time as suits him. You may give notice of the same to all the members of the Committee and invite ~~the~~ comments before that date from such of the

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members as have not yet replied to your circular letter dated the 27th February. You may consult Shri S. Varadachariar whether the presence of the auditor at the meeting is considered desirable. If so, the auditor's convenience also has to be consulted in fixing the date.
