I wish to introduce myself as a student of the Physics Department of the Indian Institute of Science, who has been working here since July 1944. I was awarded the M.Sc. degree of the Madras University in 1946 for my work on the photoconductivity of diamond and its variations and I hope to submit a thesis for the Ph.D. degree in a short time. For the last one year, I have been working as a research assistant in a C.S.I.R. scheme on the determination of Radium, Uranium etc. in some Madras granites. Since the scheme may end in next March, I would like to know whether I can get any post in the National Physical Laboratories by that time.
