Dr Atwood is an old friend of Dr Krishnan and is looking forward to the opportunity of seeing him again. Moreover he wishes to do everything necessary and possible to make Dr Krishnan's visit pleasant and profitable. Accordingly he has asked me, a member of his staff, to assist him in accomplishing this purpose. To the degree that Dr Krishnan may wish to allow plans to be made under the auspices of the National Academy, we shall arrange for him to attend

significant scientific institutions and meetings, renew old acquaintances, meet new people of interest to him, and perhaps give some lectures on a relaxed schedule.

We have reviewed the correspondence that has already passed especially between you and Dr Robertson, with respect to Dr Krishnan's visit. As a result, it occurs to us that an inevitable point of departure is our receipt, as soon as possible, of as firm an itinerary as can now be made available. We hope that this can be procured without conveying the impression that someone is trying to overorganize his visit or burden him with obligations he might wish to avoid.

If you wish it, Dr Atwood will initiate a correspondence with Dr Krishnan with the above ends in view. He of course will welcome any suggestions you may have.
