Institute of Statistics, University of Upsala: Selected Publications.


May I explain that the series is planned to include all contributions of this institute which are published in non-scandinavian languages. Our institute carries on research work in the theory and applications of probability and statistics. We expect that it will be possible to arrange one volume every year. The series is primarily intended for distribution among research and teaching organizations which are working in the same fields as this institute. The number of copies available of the first volumes, however, will be very limited owing to the shortage of paper from which we suffer here in Sweden like in many other countries.

The 3rd volume of the series now being available, I am sending it to you by the same mail, under separate cover. Unfortunately, the first volume of the series is completely exhausted. As to the second volume /S.Malmquist: A statistical analysis of the demand for liquor in Sweden/ a few copies are still available. I am not quite sure, however, whether or not I forwarded a copy of the second volume to you when we met. If not, please drop me a line, so that I may send you a copy.

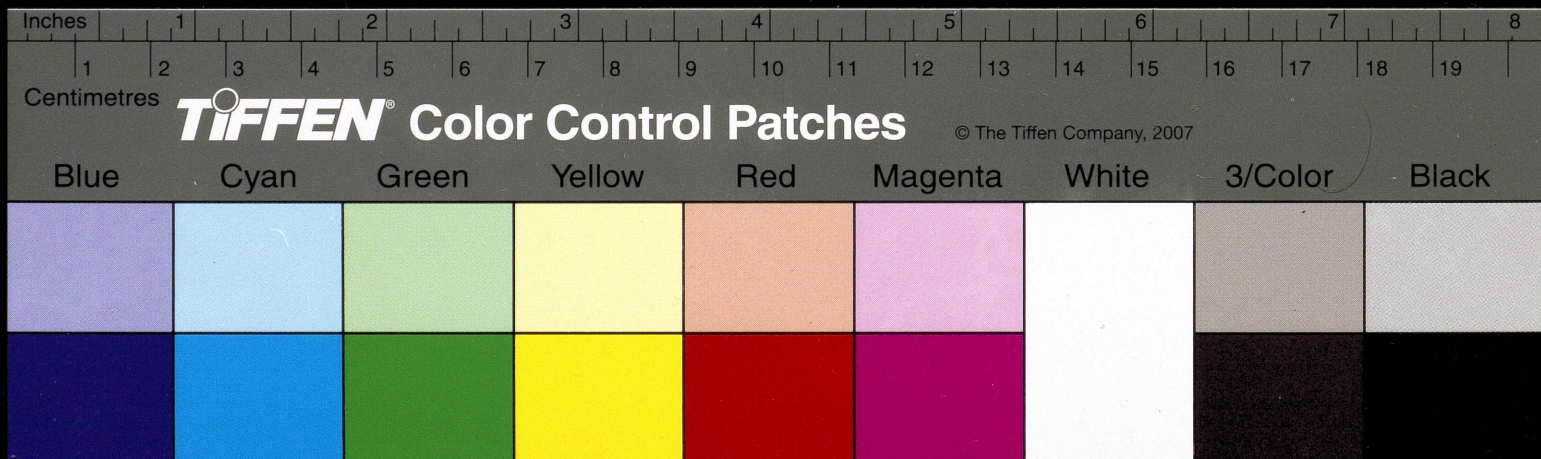

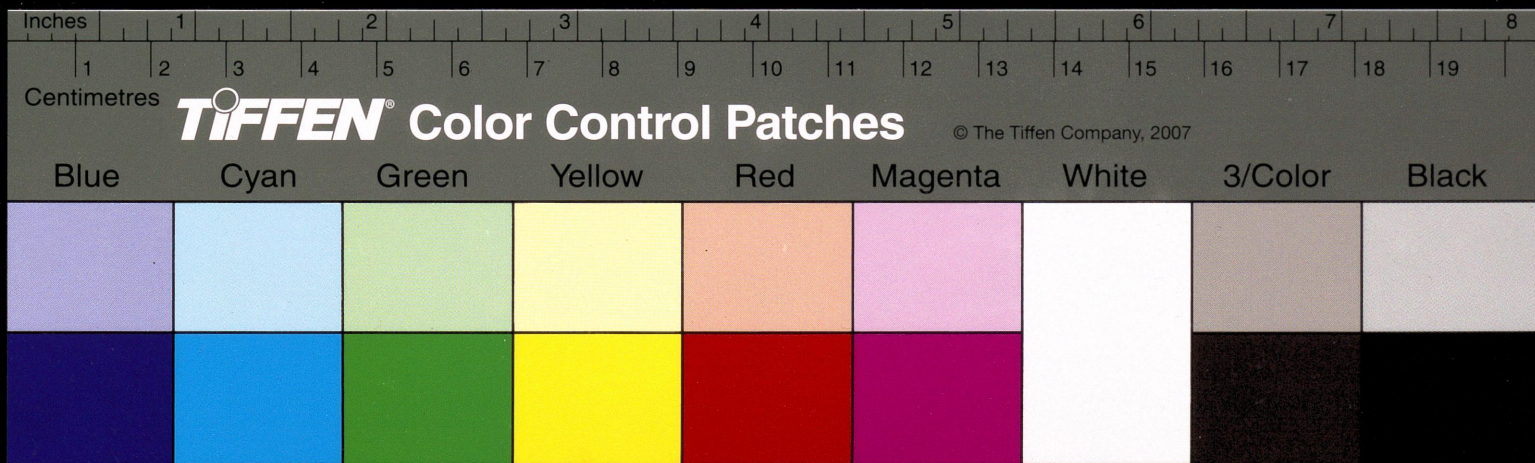
As a little token of our gratitude I inclose a few snapshots from Mysore and our excursion to Belur and Halebid.

Selected Publications.

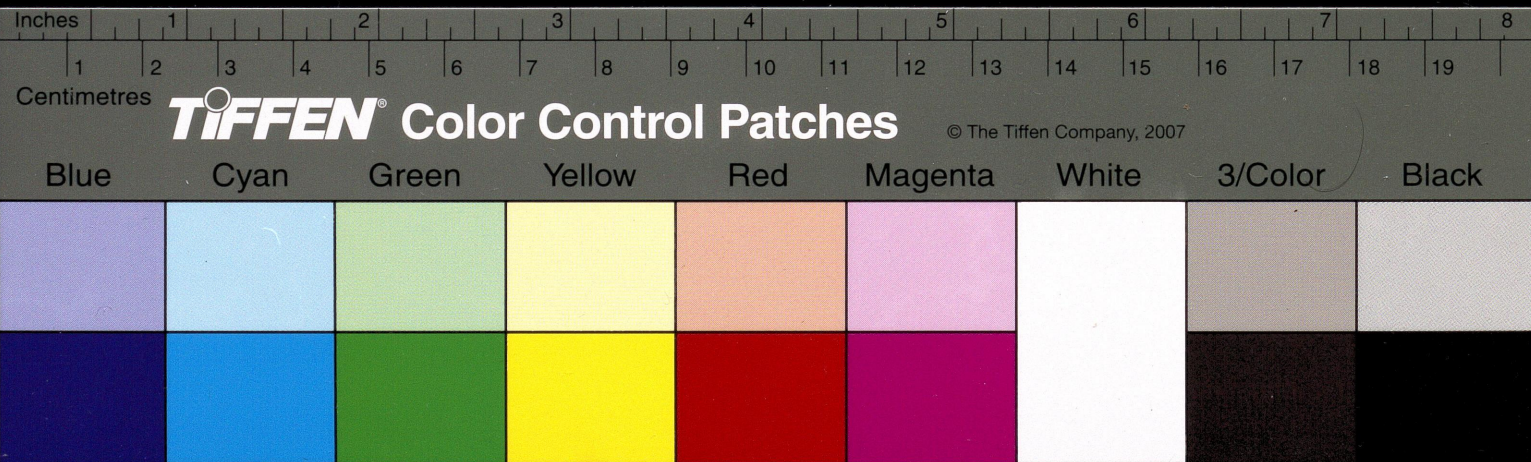

May I ask you for advice in a question raised by one of our assistants, who is in charge of revising the mailing list of our reprint series "Selected Publications"? Volumes 3-7 have been sent under the following address:

In October 1953 we sent a circular letter in order to revise and check the mailing list by way of a small form to be filled in and returned to us. Since we have never had word about our series from the library of your department, neither by this form nor otherwise, volumes 8-10 have not been sent to you. Now my assistant asks me how to proceed. Not being clear how the matter stands, I am sending you another copy of the form, and should appreciate it very much if you would help us to get it filled in and sent back here. Any advice on how to best settle this matter would be welcome. In particular I wonder whether the library of the Mathematics department is the best one for the purpose? Would it be better if the series could be placed in some other library? Much to our regret our reprint series is issued in a very small edition.
