W.D.C. C for Rockets and Satellites

At the Fifth Assembly of C.S.A.G.I. the offer of the United Kingdom to establish a World Data Centre C for Rockets and Satellites was accepted. This Centre is now in operation and its address is:

I.G.Y. WDC for Rockets and Satellites,  
Radio Research Station,  
Ditton Park,  
Slough,  
Bucks,  
England.

The Centre will collect data coming within the following categories:

Rockets

- (1) Flight information forms
- (2) Published reports of investigations

Satellites

- (1) Positional information derived from optical, radar and radio observations
- (2) Deduced orbital information
- (3) Processed telemetry information
- (4) Published reports of investigations

The World Data Centre will not, in general, collect original observations, whether these are readings in tabular form or records on paper or film. This means, for example, that recordings of the radio signals would be processed and the telemetric or other information so obtained would be sent to the Centre.

A separate circular on the prediction service will be issued to those concerned but observers who have been supplying data for prediction purposes are requested to continue to do so. Summaries of the observations will be transferred to the Data Centre periodically.

Three copies of published reports should be sent to the Data Centre so that one copy may be forwarded to each of the other two W.D.Cs.

The Data Centre will expect to receive data from the other two data centres in Washington and Moscow and every effort will be made to obtain a complete collection of all the data available. These data will be available for inspection and use by recognised workers in the subject.

This letter is intended to give only a general indication of the type of data which the Centre expects to collect; more specific information if required will be given by the Centre in the light of the experience gained in its operation.
