

As you are aware I had selected the volunteers for Rajasthan & I shall be collecting information on breeding sites of S.C. in Rajasthan. Koro division & Bharatpur - Dholpur belt are the most important S. crane areas & with the availability of funds I shall be able to visit more areas as Koro division is already fully covered by me.

Based on my observations & also of my fellow birdwatchers, I shall prepare the report as suggested & guided by you. Presently besides the field studies I am busy with the organisation of a workshop on Lesser Frigatebird. The letter is enclosed. Mr. Bharat Singh has conveyed his regards to you.


I am very much pleased to

of sarus crane.

All regional coordinators are
required to meet in the international
crane meeting in october-november 1996 at
Bharatpur. kindly let me know how to get
registered for the participation in this
meeting.

Sarus cranes are found
out side the forested area of 945 sq km
of the Kanha National Park in Balaghat
and Mondla district. Large number of
tourists including birdwatchers visit Kanha.
Therefore the Peoples Sanctuary near
Kanha National Park will have an added
advantage of tourism.
