
Dear Dr. Krishnan,

Dear Dr. Krishnan,

Please forgive me for encroaching upon your valuable time in the following matter:

Professor Dr. E. Schultze of the Technical University at Aachen has informed the Embassy that Mr. Bernd Walbaum, Assistant Professor in the Department of Physics at Aachen University, has applied to the Department of Atomic Energy, Government of India, for being allowed to participate in its annual course. Mr. S.V. Kulkarni, Assistant Controller, has replied to his application in the negative stating that no vacancies are available at the Institute. The University of Aachen had recommended Mr. B. Walbaum's application and had mentioned that he should be regarded as an exchange scholar with the understanding that any Indian candidate recommended by the Department of Atomic Energy would in turn be granted a scholarship of DM 300 (Rs. 340/-approx.) for a period of one year. In this context, it will be of interest to the Indian Government to know that 85 Indian students have been admitted to the Aachen Institute of Technology for the coming winter term and that Mr. B. Walbaum has always taken a most lively interest in the welfare of Indian students studying at Aachen.

The Aachen University would, therefore, feel greatly obliged to the Government of India if Mr. B. Walbaum's application could be favourably reconsidered in the light of the above.

I should feel very thankful if you would kindly let me have your opinion on the matter and advise me on the procedure to be adopted.
