Nova Scotia

Welcome to the oldest social club in North America!

You are helping to maintain a tradition that began in 1606 in Nova Scotia, or, as it was known then, Acadie. Your name joins a distinguished list that began with Sieur de Monts, Sieur de Poutrincourt, Marc Lescarbot, Mattieu da Costa, black explorer and Mi'kmaq interpreter, and the great explorer-historian Samuel de Champlain.

Facing all the dangers of colonization—winter's harshness, death by scurvy, and the mental depression resulting from boredom—these brave men prepared for another winter in the New World at Port Royal in Nova Scotia. Previous winters—the first on Dochet's Island in the St. Croix River, where they had lost nearly half their men from scurvy—had taken their toll in both life and spirit.

Champlain realized that part of their problems could be solved by keeping the men in good cheer. He devised a plan that would alleviate depression, and, at the same time, improve the meagre diets that had caused disease.

In November, 1606, at the beginning of their second winter at Port Royal, Champlain's visualization became reality with the organization of "L'Ordre de Bon Temps"—the Order of the Good Time.

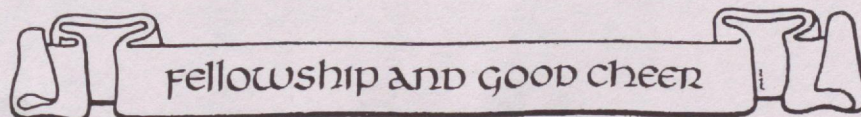
Each day one member of the group was chief steward or "Grand Master," assuming responsibility for the menu, which might include such delicacies as moose-meat pie, tender beaver tail, fresh salmon, roast caribou, or breast of goose. The meal was preceded by a ceremonial procession in which members brought the festive platters to the rough-hewn tables.

Thus, the Order of the Good Time—the first social club in the New World—fortified the spirit of the men who created a new home in the uncharted wilderness, and laid the foundations of a mighty nation.

The memory of these brave men is honoured each time a new member joins the Order of the Good Time in Nova Scotia today. Although the original order numbered 15 members, now the distinctive membership certificates adorn walls in almost every country of the world.

Today's order is unique in many ways—it collects no initiation fee, charges no dues, and never meets formally. There is only one requirement for membership—the applicant must have visited Nova Scotia for at least three days. Most visitors stay longer once they have sampled the generous hospitality extended by our residents throughout the province.

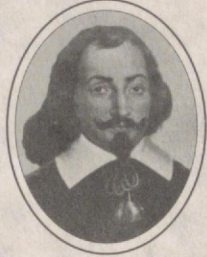
We ask only four things of our members: to have a good time, to remember us fondly, to speak of us kindly, and to come back again.
