Dear Dr. Krishnan,

You may remember my making a request to you the other day, when we met at dinner, that you may be so good as to spare some time to assist the University in screening the Science teachers of the Delhi University Colleges which have been permitted to open B.Sc. General Courses in order to determine whether they could be considered eligible for appointment for teaching B.Sc. General classes. Most of these people, as you probably know, have hitherto been teaching Pre-Medical and 1st Year Science classes; at the same time, many of them are highly qualified and presumably would be capable of teaching B.Sc. classes too. In order to see that the standards should be maintained - an objective on which we all agreed - the University suggested to the Principals of the Colleges, where B.Sc. has now been introduced, that instead of the Science teachers being automatically eligible for appointment for the B.Sc. teaching, they should first be screened and only those, who are considered eligible, would be considered for these posts. The Principals agreed to this suggestion and, I believe, also have explained the same to their Science teachers. We all thought that it would be most useful to have a distinguished scientist from outside the University to sit on this Screening Committee, and obviously we could think of nobody more appropriate for this purpose than your goodself.

Dr. M. L. Bhatia, Dean, Faculty of Science, will be contacting you in this connection, and I shall be grateful if you will kindly accept my request and fix up other details with him.
