The South India Club, the oldest and the most broad-based of South Indian Associations in Calcutta celebrates the completion of its 24th year of service in April 1950.


You are aware how the South Indian Community in Calcutta constitutes a large and important section of the public of Calcutta and the South India Club caters to their needs in several directions.
