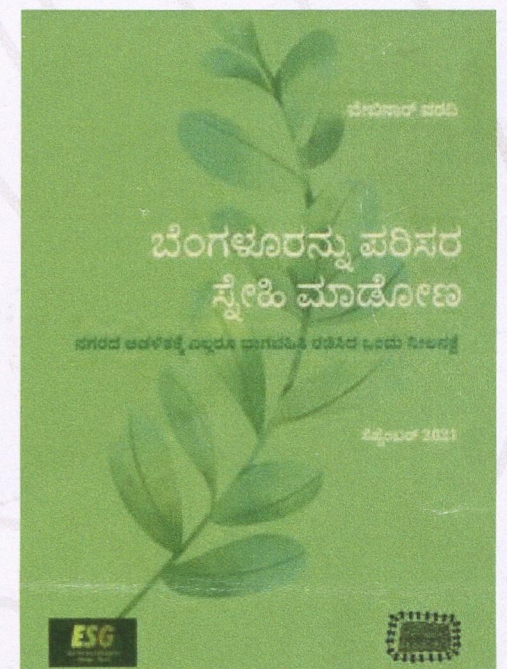
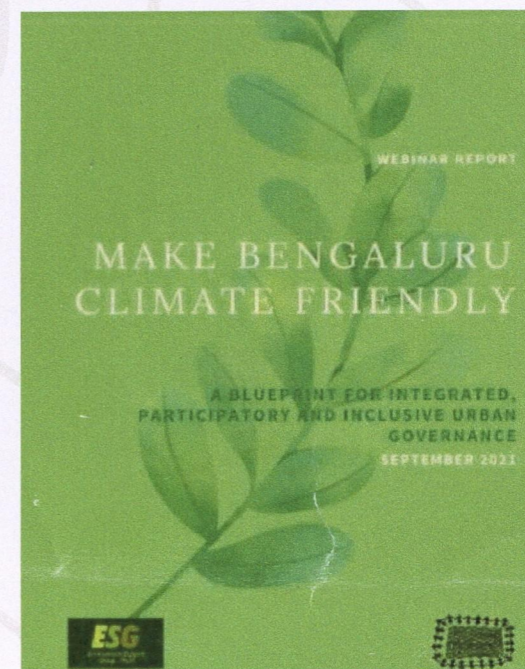
Climate action plan for a Metropolis

BENGALURU CLIMATE ACTION PLAN - A BLUEPRINT FOR INTEGRATED, PARTICIPATORY AND INCLUSIVE URBAN GOVERNANCE

When Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP), Bangalore's civic body, committed in early 2021 to achieve the targets of the Paris Climate Agreement, there was no plan that ensued. Battling through the brutal lockdown of the COVID second wave, ESG worked with multiple partners to evolve intersectoral, interdisciplinary and intersectional imaginaries to construct participatory Bengaluru's Climate Action Plan - the first such across India. Key representatives of civic agencies, subject matter experts, youth, representatives of various sectors and residents from diverse sections of the city participated in this process. This collectivisation of diverse views and synthesising nuanced solutions to tackle climate -

- change at the city and district levels is now a model emulated in other cities and towns. ESG works with multiple agencies across India to help build their local climate action plans, thus ensuring a despairing state can be transformed into one that is empowering.
